

A correspondent writing from New York city to The Guardian states that the marriage took place in Rochester recently of C. Garfield Mathieson, of Chicago, but formerly of this city, to Miss M. L. La Gurd, of France, a very beautiful and engaging young opera singer.

Last evening at 7.30 a special train left for St. Dunstan's College where another of those highly entertaining college skates was given. The League of the Cross Band furnished music most acceptable to the occasion. The special left on return at 10.30 and everyone was delighted with the happy, entertaining qualities which is at all times exhibited by the collegians.  
Last evening the Arena Rink Co., gave another of their popular ten cent skates which have been so well patronized. A cheap skate under the same ice conditions and with the regular excellent Band-night music affords many who have an "off night" an opportunity for recreation and enjoyment and is heartily supported by patrons of this popular amusement resort.

The steamer Stanley, so long in the ice near Low Point, got free yesterday. She was in her predicament because somebody on Flint Island displayed signals of distress, and as was meet and proper the Stanley was sent to find out the cause and render assistance. Flint Island lies about four miles off the coast from Grace Bay. It is nothing more than a huge rock of about four acres in extent and the sole inhabitants are the two men who tend the lighthouse. The distress signals had been flying for several days before being reported, and the steamer Montmagny was sent thither. She could not get near the island on account of the ice and the Stanley took up the task. After the Stanley became imprisoned in the ice two men managed to reach the island from the mainland on foot. They returned and reported the two lightkeepers well, but could give no reason why the distress signals were displayed. Up to the present no reason has been given, but the fact is that the Stanley, in her anxiety to succor the distress, got into a perilous position to save nothing of loss of time, when no distress existed. The matter will likely be enquired into. The steamer proceeded southwards after getting free and will likely proceed to the Magdalenis.—Halifax Herald.

The Guardian acknowledges with thanks the receipt of recent Vancouver exchanges from B. H. Balderston formerly of this city, which contain an excellent account of the burning of the Hillcrest Methodist Church of which the pastor was Rev. J. F. Belts, at one time a member of the N. B. and P. E. I. Conference and formerly stationed in this Province. Mr. Balderston, writing, states that when it was dedicated just before last Xmas it was the finest schoolroom west of the Rockies and that a great deal of sympathy is felt for Mr Belts and his congregation. The building cost about \$17,000. The exchange said: "It was the Sunday before Christmas last that saw the formal opening of the destroyed building, and only yesterday the final touch was put to its adornment by the erection of a hand rail. It was finally destined to become the Sunday school in the plan which was being followed out, but had accommodation for 600 people, besides stalls for a score of classes, and a spacious basement in which the younger members had recently fitted up athletic apparatus and a basketball rig. Nothing was saved beyond the organ, a desk, some chairs and books. It was stated that there were some boxes stored in the basement near the furnace, and it is surmised that these may have caught fire from the heat and started the conflagration. Standing among the showering sparks Pastor Belts viewed the ruin of his latest work—he has built eleven churches and three parsonages during a long career of usefulness—but acting up to his preaching of the need of viewing the bright side of things, he was already planning for a new beginning. "Just as soon as it gets cold enough," he said, "we expect to start in and build again. Already two gentlemen have voluntarily come forward with a total offer of \$600 towards the new church."
