LETTER FROM CARTER & CO., LIMITED.

Dear Sir:—A letter appeared in the Examiner of April 27th, also Guardian of 28th, signed by Theodore Ross, in which Mr. Ross made the following statement: "That the Seed Inspector, S. J. Moore, who has been in this Province for the last few days inspecting Seed, reports that Wild Oats is very prevalent in the Seed Grain being offered for sale, and that particularly some of the Barley, Oats and Wheat being offered in Charlottetown is not fit for Seed on account of it." He also states "That Summerside is not free from it either by any means." As an old established Seed firm we cannot allow this letter to go broadcast throughout the country unchallenged.

The above statement is, we believe, not according to the facts, and is calculated to injure the Seed business of different handlers of Seeds and Seed grain in this City and elsewhere in this Province, who are we are sure doing all they can to supply good pure Seed. We have been in the Seed business for twenty-seven years, and have handled very many thousands of bushels of Imported Seed Wheat. Have been large importers since the year 1883, and we have never yet seen any Wild Oats come therein. We certainly take exception to this statement, and as far as we are concerned, we are not selling nor have we sold to the best of our knowledge, any Imported Seed Wheat containing Wild Oats (we do not handle Island grown Seed Wheat).

Again, as far as Wild Oats being found in Imported Seed Oats is concerned, we have been importing and selling Oats for probably fifteen years, and have sold many thousands of bushels. Mr. Ross has stated that this Province is practically free from Wild Oats, and that out of some two hundred and twenty samples of Island grown Oats shown at the Seed Fair this winter, there was only two samples containing a small percentage of Wild Oats. Last year we sold several thousand bushels of Imported Oats purchased in Ontario—the year before a much larger quantity. These Oats were scattered all over this Province. Previous to this we have sold large quantities, and we venture to say that the probability is nearly every sample shown at the Seed Fair was the product of our importations. So that we are safe in stating that we have been selling Oats free from Wild Oats for many years. This year there has been more than two hundred bushels of Imported Oats come to this Province for Seed purposes—not as much as ten average farmers combined would sow. The crop of Oats in this Province last year being so good and the price of Imported Oats so high, we only imported a small quantity. So that it is a very small matter to raise such a fuss about, considering that upwards of one hundred thousand bushels will probably be sown by the farmers this year.

We had a visit from the Seed Inspector last week, and he did not tell us that our Oats or Barley—or what for that matter—contained a percentage of Wild Oats. Mr. Ross states that the merchants labelling this grain as containing Wild Oats. This also is not so, so far as our merchants here are concerned. True, some Oats and Barley have arrived here labelled as follows: "Contents of the bag may contain a very small percentage of Wild Oats and Cocks, and this label is in compliance with the Seed Control Act."

This tag is put on for the reason that it is impossible for the inspectors to ascertain whether all the Grain is absolutely free from the above-named Weed Seeds. In such cases the Department has permitted them to use this tag. It says that out of two million four hundred thousand bushels of Ontario Oats forwarded to Winnipeg, only twenty-four thousand bushels were accepted for the reason that it contained Wild Oats is absurd. There were certainly other and more weighty reasons than that. We are very well that the crop of Oats in Ontario was so poor last year that only a very small percentage of it was fit for Seed, even if it was absolutely free from Weed Seeds of any kind as a large percentage would not germinate.

We can assure the farmers of Prince Edward Island that for many years we have used our very best endeavors to procure the purest and best Seed grain and Seeds of all kinds obtainable, buying nothing but the highest grade of Seeds that could be bought. We have absolutely refused to handle cheap quality, and we believe—and it has been so stated by the Inspector—that the Seed and Seed grain we sell in Prince Edward Island is much better than in any other of the Provinces.

We are fully alive to this matter, and are looking forward to the time when the farmers of this Province will be practically free from noxious Weeds.

RAN THE RAPIDS TO THEIR DEATH

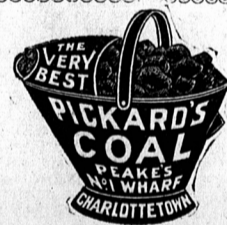
Two Foolhardy Canoeists Drown at Milo Junction— One Reaches Shore Alive

MILO, April 29—The determination of Julian Schumacher, aged 22, to run the rapids of the Piscaquis river near the Bangor & Aroostook bridge at Milo Junction in a canoe resulted in the death by drowning of himself and Horace Stewart, aged 21 and the narrow escape of a young companion, named Davis, who managed to swim to one of the shores. A week ago Schumacher tried the feat alone and was capsized by one of the many submerged rocks but was rescued by friends on shore. Undaunted by that experience and expressing his intention to succeed at the next attempt, he put off with his two companions and headed for the rapids. They had progressed but a short distance into the treacherous waters when the canoe overturned and all were upset into the turbulent waters. Not so fortunate as on the previous experience Schumacher succumbed after being battered about and was drowned as was Stewart. Their bodies were not recovered. Davis fought his way to shore. None of the young men were married.

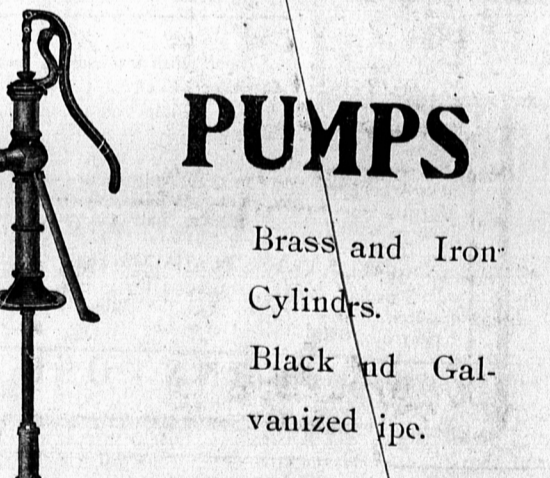
