Halifax Club

Not Out Of Play

CALEDONIA CONSIDERS WAN-
DERERS OUT; MARITIME TITLE
FINAL MAY NOT BE PLAYED
THIS YEAR

FREDERICTON, N. B., Nov. 21.—
The situation with regard to the Mc-
Curdy Cup play-off which has been
unsettled for some time past, became
much more complicated today when
the University of New Brunswick
athletic authorities were informed by
telephone by Halifax Wanderers that
Wanderers did not consider them-
selves out of the series and intended
to press for some recognition in the
Nova Scotia section.
Wanderers stated that they never
had been notified by the Maritime
Rugby Football Union that they
were disqualified or that Caledonia
had the right to represent Nova
Scotia in a play-off with a New
Brunswick team. On account of lack
of such notification Wanderers would
challenge Caledonia to a match on
neutral grounds to decide the Nova
Scotia title.
In addition the statement was
made on behalf of the Wanderers
that the regulations of the Mari-
time Union was violated by Caledonia
when the MacTier Cup match
was played on Saturday last the
15th had been the date specified by
the Union for the completion of
semi-finals and Caledonia, according
to the claim of the Wanderers, dis-
regarded the claim. If the contention
of the Halifax Club is ignored it
will enter a formal protest.
Negotiations between Caledonia
and University of New Brunswick
have been going on for some days
for a final match for the Maritime
title and cup. The situation with re-
gard to the local college team has
been complicated by the expressed
wish of Chancellor Jones that no
more time be lost on football trips.
