Steel Mill Backlogs Increasing Steadily

CLEVELAND, Jan. 22 — (AP)—Steel mill backlogs are increasing steadily, the magazine Steel said today.

The trade journal attributed the situation to "heavier war require-ments, handicaps to production from inability to obtain sufficient manpower and interruption of raw material supplies by heavy snow."

"Buying has increased rapidly since the turn of the year and is by far the largest factor in heavier order books," commented the steel publication. "Weather conditions over much of the producing area have prevented attainment of higher operating rates, though they have not cut deeply into the existing high rate."

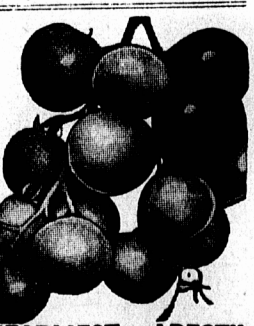
