The Summerside Relief Committee received yesterday through W. K. McCougan, a cheque for \$25 from Brock & Patterson, St. John.

EDWARD HAYWOOD, of O'Leary, and Bessie, eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Alana Town, of Rockport, were united in marriage last Wednesday evening at Main street Baptist parsonage, Sackville, N. B. Rev. B. N. Nobles was the officiating clergyman. Mr. and Mrs. Haywood left for a honeymoon trip to P. E. I. land.

In reply to 18 letters of appeal sent out by the ladies of St. Mary's church, Summerside, whose church, rectory and guild hall were destroyed by the recent fire, \$101 have so far been received with a promise of \$90 to be sent in by the first of the year. Members of the congregation in Summerside, have subscribed \$1203. The Bishop has granted leave to the rector, Rev. Mr. Webber, to make a general appeal to the churches throughout the diocese.

ANGUS MCKINNON, Coleman, received word yesterday that the schooner Torridon had foundered on the East Point of Anticosti. The crew consisted of five men and there is no word yet as to their safety. The schooner was owned by the Gaspe Lumber Company and was captained by Mrs. She was driven out of her course by gales during the early part of October. It is reported in Summerside that the captain and mate left the schooner in a boat and were afloat for seven days until picked up at Estevan, Quebec. The rest of the crew are said to have left the schooner on a raft and that the raft went to pieces. This is merely a report, unconfirmed.

A SPECIAL meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held last night, the full Board present, with the exception of Councillor Marbut. Councillor Reid introduced a motion asking that a day be named for the election of three water commissioners, their remuneration to be given with the letting of the contract for the waterworks. After discussion the motion carried 4 to 1; the voters for being Reid, Dobson, Ryan, Cox; and McKinnon being against the motion. Wednesday, December 19, is the date of the election. A letter was read from Percy Tanton, asking for 20 years tax exemption for his proposed new factory and lumber yard. It was pointed out that in order to secure exemption notice would have to be published in the paper; also that 10 years was the limit allowed; but the Council testified its willingness to do all they could for the applicant. The Mayor advised the Council to confer with the Board of Health and take precautions to avoid any danger of contracting smallpox from the infected area in New Brunswick and the Council and Board will meet for that purpose this morning.
