England's Greatest Quartette.

## FAMOUS MEISTER MALE QUARTETTE

Which Will Visit Charlottetown on October 6th and 7th.

The Meister Glee Singers are recognized as the pre-eminent masters of Glee and Part Song singing in Great Britain—the home of the art. The quartette which was formed some twelve years ago has gained a fame in England never attained by any other musical organization, and its continued career of success is a speaking evidence of its artistic excellence. So much in demand have been their services at home that the forthcoming tour is the first opportunity they have been able to secure of crossing the Atlantic.

The Meister Singers have sung virtually at every important concert in Great Britain, including the tour of Madame Patti, the festivals of the Liverpool Philharmonic, the London Ballad concerts at St. James' Hall. They have been engaged by Madame Marie Roze, Madame Nordica and Madame Nikita for their tours, and have themselves undertaken an annual tour of the country every autumn for the past ten years.

They have had the honor of singing before Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, His Majesty the King, and other members of the Royal Family.

It may be stated without exaggeration that the Canadian public has never yet seen anything in the art of singing to equal the delightful work of the Meister Glee Singers. It is due to them that the lost art of glee singing has been revived in England. They have had their imitators but never their equals. Their repertoire is a most comprehensive one, and includes specimens of the old English classical glee, quartettes, both grave and humorous, folk songs, harmonized airs and psalmody melodies, with bouche fermee and imitation banjo accompaniments.

**MR. AGER GROVER, Tenor,**  
Received his musical education in the choir of Westminster Abbey, where he was solo boy for six years, under Sir Frederick Bridge. Three years after leaving the Abbey he started singing tenor, and has held appointments as soloist at All Saints', Margaret Street, St. Andrew's, Well Street, so well-known for the beauty of its musical services, and at the Temple Church—a position he still holds. To quote from an article which appeared in The Sketch on Mr. Grover's abilities: "A gift from the gods, indeed, is a tenor voice—sweet in its timbre such, for instance, as that possessed by Mr. Ager Grover. In ballad singing, at the principal concert halls in London and in the provinces, his natural mezzo voice has been most effectively successful."

**MR. FORD WALTHAM, Basso,**  
Studied at the Royal Academy of Music for three years, under Mr. Arthur Thompson, the well-known singing professor, gaining bronze and silver medals for singing, opera and elocution. He has visited all the principal provincial towns in concert and operatic work, and toured with all the great artists, such as Madame Patti, and has always received the highest commendations of the press for his fine singing.

**MR. ALFRED CUNNINGHAM, Baritone,**  
Is the youngest member of the Meister Glee Singers, and during the time he has been before the public his exceptional voice and high dramatic ability gained him a foremost position as a vocalist. When a boy he was trained by Mr. Edwin H. Lemare, the well-known organist and conductor, now at Pittsburgh. In addition to his being the Solo Treble for three years at the Sheffield Parish Church, he won the singing prize at the Sheffield Royal Grammar School each year for a similar period. His appearance as a Baritone was attended by the most flattering results, as during his first concert season he gained from the press the title of the "New Yorkshire Baritone." Soon afterwards he was induced by a well-known manager to appear on the operatic stage, and for a considerable time he toured the United Kingdom with pronounced success in both grand and light opera.

In their concerts here this famous Quartette will be assisted by two talented artists—Mr. Roland Henry in Humorous Musical Sketches and Miss Ethel Henry, Elocutionist.

**MR. WILLIAM SEXTON, ALTO,**  
Is also Vicar Choral of Westminster Abbey. He was musically educated under Dr. Buck of Norwich Cathedral, from whence he obtained the principal Alto position at York Minister, which he gained by competition the Solo Alto position at St. George's Chapel Royal, Windsor Castle. After remaining some time a vacancy occurred among the Vicars Choral of Westminster Abbey, and after a competition among 25 of the best voices in the kingdom, he was appointed, where he still remains. He is the first Alto of Meister Glee Singers, and helped to form the Quartette which has gained a worldwide reputation for their unique ensemble. He was also for years conductor of a celebrated Male Voice Choir—the Victoria Glee Club; conductor of the Royal Victoria

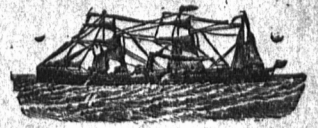
