AMONG those leaving the City yesterday were John Lawson, of the P O Department to Cardigan; A J W Myers, Lake Verde, on return to Toronto to resume his studies in Knox College; Miss Florrie Coffin, for Toronto where she will enter the General Hospital to begin the study of nursing; Miss Winnie McLeod who accompanied her.

THE first football match in the Provincial League series will be played in the C A A grounds Thursday afternoon between the Abegweit and Victoria teams. Both teams have been practicing hard, and as this will be the first meeting on the football field of these old hockey rivals, an exciting game will doubtless result. The game is the first fall holiday game that has been played here for some time, and a large attendance is expected.

THE regular monthly meeting of the School Board was held last evening at eight o'clock. All the members were present. The teachers' reports for last month showed the enrolment for the past month to be 1186—the average attendance 1075 and the per centage of attendance 91. There were 98 cases of tardiness reported, 11 cases of truancy, 53 cases of corporal punishment, 114 requests to leave school before closing, 130 visits by teachers and 42 notices to parents. Permission was granted to the teachers of Prince Street School to employ an instructor in music. Permission was also given to hold a concert to defray expenses of same providing it did not interfere with the children's studies. The Board rescinded the order allowing children to play on the Prince Street school grounds in the evenings on account of the injury done to a number of trees and the destruction of plants. A petition was received from a number of teachers who are anxious to take up Manual Training Work, that they would appreciate anything the Board would do to make arrangements for the same. The Secretary was directed to inform the teachers that they could make any arrangements with the teachers of Manual Training, they chose but that the Board were not prepared to incur any expenses.

BRITISH MINISTER SNUBS.

PEKIN, Oct. 9.—The Empress Dowager gave her first audience of the season in the summer palace today. Sir Ernest Satow, the British minister, and the entire staff of the British legation, were absent, it is understood, on account of the throned dereliction in the case of the arrested members of the staff of the Chinese reform newspaper. Supac at Shanghai, for whom the Chinese government has refused to provide a magistrate thus compelling the prisoners, whom it hopes to dispose of, to remain in jail and also on account of the flogging to death of the Chicago reformer Shen Chien, whose execution was ordered by the Dowager Empress.
