Cincinnati Reds Take Two-game Bite Out Of Brooklyn Dodger's Lead

NEW YORK, June 16 — (AP) — Cincinnati Reds took a two-game bite out of the Dodgers' National League lead today by beating them 1-0 and 5-2 at Brooklyn. The double victory returned the Reds to second place and reduced the Dodger lead to a matter of points.

Benno Paul Derringer's six-hit shutout pitched the Reds won the first game in the ninth when Louie Frey's line drive became a trick home run. It was Derringer's ninth victory.

Successful home runs by Pete Cosewicz and Leo Durocher in the second game were the only runs scored by the Dodgers.

Chicago Cubs earned an even break in their four-game series with the Reds by splitting a doubleheader at Boston dropping the opener 5-4 in 11 innings and taking the second game 3-1.

An eight-run outburst in the sixth inning and Claude Passeau's five-hit pitching decided the nightcap.

The opener was a see-saw contest with the Cubs getting out to a fast start when Manager Gabby Hartnett hit his first homer of the year in the second.

Max Bauser and Truett Sewell pitched Pittsburgh Pirates to a twin triumph over the Giants at New York. Bauser blanking the Giants made two hits to win the opener 3-0 while the Pirates took the nightcap 5-3. The double loss dropped the Terrymen into third place.

The Worm Turns As St. Louis Browns Beat Yanks In Doubleheader

NEW YORK, June 16 — (AP) — The worm turned today as the Browns, conquered seven consecutive times by New York Yankees this season, snipped a double defeat on the world champions, 12-6 and 6-5 at St. Louis.

The Browns in the first game got seven doubles and a homer by pitcher Vernon Kennedy in a 13-hit assault. Joe Dimaggio and Frankie Crosetti homered for the Yankees and Red Rolfe hit three doubles.

In the nightcap, Dimaggio hit his ninth home run with two men on base. Crosetti led off the game with a homer.

But the Browns kept pecking away as run at a time. Roy Cullenbine and Johnny Berardino hitting circuit-clouts off Marvin Breuer, who was finally driven from the box in the seventh inning.

A barrage of home runs gave the pace-setting Boston Red Sox a 4-3 and 4-3 at Chicago.

Ted Williams boomed a 12th-inning home run to give the leader the first game. Five homers in the first six innings virtually settled the outcome of the nightcap. The two victories gave Boston a clean sweep of the four-game series with the Sox.

The Red Sox now are 2-1-2 games ahead of Cleveland and Detroit and six full games ahead of New York Yankees in fourth place. In the second game of the doubleheader from the Yankees, the Browns made a comeback as Barney McCosky delivered a ball in the first out-pitch victory, and southpaw Alton Bower grabbed his ninth triumph in the eighth.
