SERVING JESUS

Lesson. Luke vii, 1-3; ix., 57-62; Golden Text. Matthew xxv., 40.

"And the King will answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did it unto one of these, My brethren, even these least, ye did it unto Me."

THE NARRATIVE

The three paragraphs which constitute our lesson give us three pictures which are full of interest.

The first takes us back to a period before Caesarea Philippi when Jesus was travelling from place to place through cities and villages. It would seem to have been a period when He had departed from His usual custom of returning to Capernaum. The paragraph gives us the one glimpse we have of how His material needs were met during such journeyings. Luke tells us that He and His disciples were accompanied by a number of women, who ministered to Him of their substance, all of whom had been healed by Him either of demon

a careful consideration of its setting. The Lord had been praying, evidently observed by His disciples, fact that we have no record of His praying together with His disciples. It is evident that they were often with Him when He prayed, but that He prayed in separation from them. This statement Luke had already made in one instance, very clearly. "It came to pass, as He was praying alone, the disciples were with Him" (ix. 18) On this occasion when He ceased they said to Him, "Lord, teach us to pray even as John also taught us to pray." They did not interrupt Him until His praying was over, but we are certainly warranted in believing that as they watched Him, and in all probability listened to Him, there came to them a realization of the place and power of prayer in His own life, and of their limitation in this regard.

We should moreover carefully observe that they did not ask Him to teach them how to pray, but to pray. This is an important distinction. It is quite possible to know how to do it, and yet to be quite unable to pray.

His answer was really a very careful and illuminative. He first repeated in an abbreviated form the prayer which He had given them in His Manifesto. He then gave them the parable or illustration which gives title to our lesson, and finally repeated certain things He had said before, adding to them certain illustrations by way of argument.

His repetition of the prayer already given, nothing essential is omitted. The first movement is that of prayer for the coming of the Kingdom; while the second deals with the needs of His people under the present conditions of their lives. The value of the illustration and subsequent teaching will be seen more clearly when we come to consider the teaching.

The Golden Test is simply the command linked with promises. It is the simple charter of prayer, and must be interpreted by all the rest of the teaching.

possession, or of some form of disease. Three of them are named. The first was Mary of Magdala, from whom He had cast out seven demons. The second was Joanna, the wife of Magdala at the grave on the morning of the resurrection. The third was Susanna, who is mentioned nowhere else. The probability is that some, and perhaps all, of these were women of wealth, who thus followed Him and the twelve from place to place, and ministered unto them of their substance.

The second picture is that of three men whom He encountered in the first stages of the journey when "He steadfastly set His face to go to Jerusalem." The first of these immediately declared his determination to follow the Lord whithersoever He went. The second, Jesus called to follow Him, and he, while discussing, pleaded his duty to his father as a difficulty. The third declared his determination to follow, but asked permission to bid farewell to his own people.

In dealing with these men He revealed the conditions upon which it is possible to serve Him. To the man who impulsively declared his determination, the Lord made it perfectly clear that in order to such following there must be severance from all possessions that would hinder. To the one who urged his duty to his father, He declared the supremacy of the claims of the Kingdom of God. To the one who asked for time for the fulfilment of the claim of earthly affection, He revealed the necessity for the severance of every earthly tie that would prevent consecration to the work of the Kingdom.

The third picture is the very familiar and yet beautiful one of our Lord's visit, to the home of Martha, and the service rendered by her and her guest, is that He had not sent in the eagerness of her devotion, attempting to express distracted, and finally complaining against what she considered the carelessness of her guest, that He had not sent her sister to help her. Mary, on the other hand, is revealed as having taken part in the service of the house, as the little word "also" in verse 39 reveals, and then seeking the place of discipleship and worship at His feet.
