### Board Named To Examine General Motors Strike

DETROIT, Dec. 12 (AP) — President Truman named a fact-finding board to look into the General Motors strike today and the O. I. O. United Automobile Workers promised to co-operate with the group.

When Mr. Truman announced his plan Dec. 3, there was criticism from union circles on grounds that for a board to start inquiries with negotiations in progress might impede or delay a settlement.

Shortly after the President named the members of the board today, however, the U. A. W. announced its intention to co-operate.

In another automobile industry dispute over the United Automobile Workers' 30-per-cent wage increase demand, the Ford Motor Corp. any parried the union's proposal.

Ford said it preferred to get into full production before a general wage discussion, citing such production as a "joint" effort for the union and management.

Named by Mr. Truman to the fact-finding body were Chief Justice William P. Stacy of the North Carolina Supreme Court, chairman, Lloyd K. Garrison of the War Labor Board and President Milton Eisenhower of Kansas State College brother of the Army's Chief of Staff Gen. Dwight Eisenhower.

Justice Stacy was named chairman. The group will hold its first meeting in Washington.

"We understand from the President," Mr. Garrison said, "that the appointment of our board is not intended to interfere in any way with the parties' collective bargaining which now is in process, and that it is greatly to be hoped that the parties will settle their differences by agreement."

Negotiations between General Motors and the union will resume tomorrow.

### DR. H. E. BAIRD APPOINTED TO REGINA GENERAL HOSPITAL

REGINA, Dec. 12 (CP) — Alderman H. E. Baird, chairman of Regina General Hospital Board, today announced appointment of Dr. H. E. Baird of Fredericton as superintendent, at a salary of \$6,000 annually. Dr. Baird is expected to assume his post about Feb. 1.

G. E. Patterson, who has been acting superintendent since September, 1944, will continue as hospital administrator and secretary.

**WEST INDIES WINTER ROUTE OPENS**

MONTREAL, Que., Dec. 12 —The Canadian National (West Indies) steamships have been appointed passenger agents for the forthcoming voyage from Halifax to Jamaica of the 'Jamaica Producer,' owned by the Jamaica Banana Producers Steamship Co. Ltd. It was announced today by Victor E. Eke, passenger traffic manager, C.N.A.

The SS. 'Jamaica Producer' is expected at Halifax about December 18th or 19th from the United Kingdom and will sail that day or shortly afterwards for Kingston, Jamaica. There is accommodation available for forty cabin passengers, which can be used for non-priority passengers.

From present indications, it is expected passengers desiring of sailing in this vessel will require to leave Montreal tomorrow or Friday night for Halifax.
