Gunder Haegg Faces Stiff Race Today

SAN FRANCISCO, July 16—(AP)—Gunder Haegg, the Swedish streak, will run what should prove to be the toughest race of his American tour tomorrow.

The Swedish star will be running over this particular route for the first time in this country. Thus far he has made a show of it against opposition over two miles and 5,000 meters.

Haegg's chief rival tomorrow at Kezar Stadium will be Gil Dadds, bespectacled divinity student from Boston. Dadds saw nothing but the lanky Haegg's back in two-mile rambles in Los Angeles but at half the distance confidently expects to make a better showing.

Two of the steps came from government ministers' concern with the welfare of mothers and their babies.
