The Premier claimed that no lien would be created. He said it was up to the prosecutor to sell it at once.

Mr. Stewart went on to declare that the statute created a lien, without registration or notice.

Premier Saunders moved that the clause be allowed to stand over. This motion was carried.

Dr. MacMillan relative to clause four asked what was the necessity for extra magistrates?

Premier Saunders said there was a feeling that the Magistrates were not satisfactory. The temperance people wanted the three extra magistrates, for they thought the present ones did not enforce the law in cases.

Mr. Stewart suggested that the clause stand over until the clause appointing them be passed. It is unprecedented in the British Empire to create a judiciary for one sort of crime.

The Premier thought there was something in what Mr. Stewart said. He repeated that there were those among them our prosecutors, who had told him, that when certain offenders were up it was useless to take them before the Magistrates.

The Premier said that Mr. Stewart's interpretation was unreasonable. The law would be interpreted in a reasonable way, and he did not think such a case would ever arise.

Mr. MacPhee thought the guilty party should be arrested wherever he was. The clause was agreed to as read.

Mr. MacLure asked if the magistrates would be barristers, learned in the law, or was it the intention just to get magistrates who will convict. This seems to call for magistrates who will convict whether a man is guilty or not.

As a legislative body, we should have some common sense in this matter. The Premier went on to say that often where facts and circumstances have been sworn to before the Magistrate, he has taken too long to consider the matter, so that when the prosecutor searched his premises nothing was found.

In this bill everything ridiculous that can be brought in to make the act a farce in the eyes of the law and of the public, is worked in to perfection.

The Premier himself suggested several alterations to clause seven, as drafted in the bill.

Dr. MacMillan thought the clause was a wonderful monument to the incompetence of some one. It must be the incompetence of the government.

Mr. Stewart again emphasized the unfair features of the section by which, if a man's place is found closed, a man must go and prove himself innocent of a charge of breach of the prohibition act.

Mr. Lea stated that the purpose of the clause was to help the officers to clean up dens of iniquity. Its purpose was to allow the officers to enter such places.

Mr. Stewart said that the section did not enable the officer to get in, it only provided for prima facie evidence of guilt.

The clause was carried. (At 1 p. m. the House adjourned.)

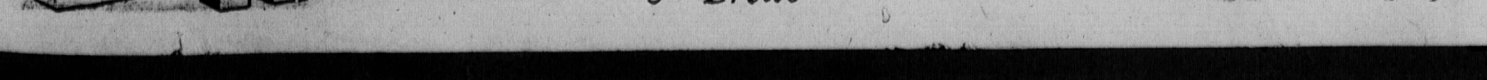
