There will be services in St. Thomas church, Long Creek, on Sunday May 27th at 11 o'clock a. m., and in St. John's church Crapaud at 7 p. m.

The valedictorian at St. Dunstan's College commencement on June 5th will be P. F. MacDonald of West St. Peters and the prize essayist H. MacDonald of St. Theresa's.

Among other freight by the City of London from Crapaud last evening was a beautiful driving mare. This animal was bought in Tryon and is to be forwarded to parties in N. v. Scotia.

Rev. S. J. McArthur, a native of Tyne Valley, P. E. I., and formerly stationed at New Glasgow, N. S. will be inducted into the charge of Chatham N. B. congregation on Tuesday. A reception was tendered him after the service.

Hector Russell McLeod, aged 19, son of Alexander McLeod, first officer of the N. B. Fishery, died on Thursday. The deceased had been ill for a month and went West in the vain hope of recovering himself. He returned to the province a week ago with his sister, Mrs. Geo. Muir.

Writers in this Province who trade on the Atlantic Coast will be glad to know that there is to be installed at Cape Race a new first-class dioptric lantern at the light station there. The light tower was constructed last autumn by the Marine and Fisheries Department. This will be the largest lighting apparatus ever installed in Canada, and probably one of the largest in the world. The large lantern, inside of which the vapor lamps will be burning, is 17 feet in diameter, and will possess over 1700 kilowatts. The light is expected to show clearly for over 30 miles. The parts of the apparatus and the lamps arrived in Halifax last autumn and were stored in the Dockyard.

The admirers of association football who are trying to introduce that style of game here may be interested in knowing the extent to which it is played in Scotland. Scotsmen dearly love to indulge in all manner of athletic sport, and they have been singularly successful competitors in the arena. One form of athletic sports which is more popular than others in the land of the mountain and flood, is Association Football which has drawn in the vicinity of one hundred thousand spectators to one game on several occasions during this season at different places in Scotland and England, and this continues Saturday after Saturday for a good portion of the year. In Glasgow there is at present close on two hundred professional football players. Other clubs are equally enthusiastic, proving conclusively that Association Foot is Scotland's premier sport.

In the course of a flattering lecture, delivered recently in Lynn, Mass., by Wm. Hamilton, Chief of the Lynn Caledonian Club, on Prince Edward Island, in speaking of Charlottetown he thus described it: 'Charlottetown, inside of Hillsborough Bay--called popularly Ch-town for short--is the capital, a quiet place with about 11,000 inhabitants, 15 has three squares, and Queen square, the only one that has had any attempt at ornamentation made in its behalf, is a decided addition to the city, besides being very beautiful. In its immediate vicinity are three public buildings, while the adjacent grounds laid out in tastefully shaped flower beds, and during the months of June, July and August a mass of gorgeous as well as dainty blooms, the beauty of which is only rivalled when the deepening autumn changes the foliage to warm red hues, golden leaves gleaming here and there as if to suggest that summer is loth to say 'good-bye.' A fountain cascades cool refreshing waters into the pond below, while in close proximity stands a handsome monument erected recently in memory of several Island boys who sacrificed their lives on a South African Veldt during the late Boer war. A bandstand in the centre tells of many summer evenings rendered pleasant by the strains of music supplied by the city bands.'

There was an unusually large attendance at Belvidere Golf links yesterday, the first regular meet of the season, and although the weather was a little cool some good games were enjoyed and the present spent a pleasant afternoon. Tea was served at the club house by Mrs. Davis, Mrs. Jenkins, and Miss Anderson. Conway, the professional who was here last year is expected to arrive next month to coach club members.

A collision between two teams of Thursday resulted in a nice mare, owned by Mr. Fredericksen of Malpeque Road, being somewhat seriously injured through the shaft of the opposing team piercing her shoulder, making a nasty cut. The mare, which is a very affect creature showed the advantage of kind treatment of a horse immediately after the accident when she started to run. On hearing her master's voice commanding her to stop, although she was running with a loose rein, she at once obeyed and was taken charge of.

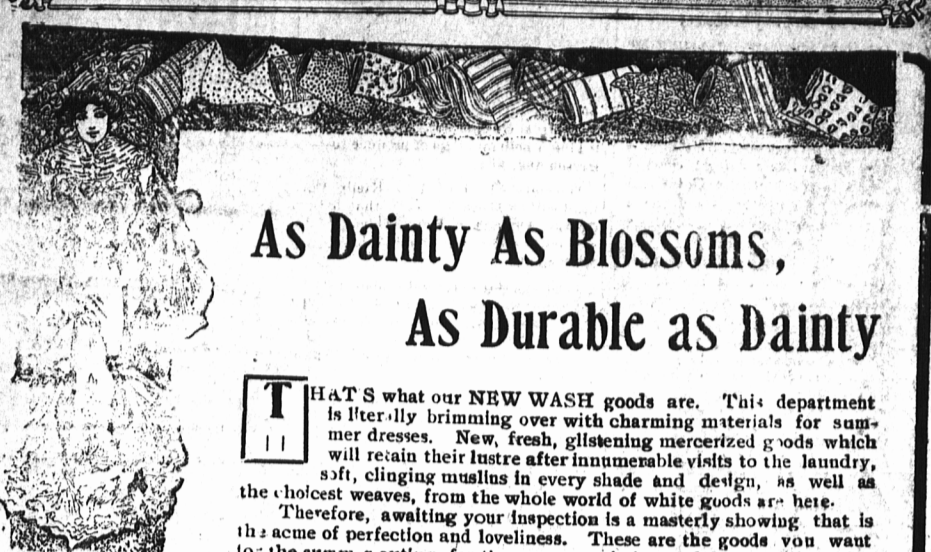

The cause of numerous diseases and disagreeable habits, heretofore ascribed as constitutional, have been traced directly to the teeth. Blindness, drooping, frothing, loss of flesh, weak eyes, driving on one rein and pulling are very often due to diseased and irregular teeth. Rough edges and sharp corners of the teeth lacerate the mouth, and produce nervousness and irritability; uneven and elongated molar and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general debility. Decayed molars cause necrosis of the bone, abscesses, nasal gleet, etc. These causes should be removed. Decayed teeth should be removed by extracting or trepanning, sharp corners and rough edges should be smoothed down, and elongated and uneven molars and incisors cut off.
