From the Northfield Student Conference.

MR. GEORGE IRVING

Gives Some Idea of the Good Accomplished by the Meet.

As announced in yesterday's GUARDIAN Mr. George Irving arrived in the city at an early hour yesterday morning. Yesterday a GUARDIAN representative had a short conversation with him in reference to the Northfield student conference. At first Mr. Irving did not care to say much but the following was secured.

On Sunday the sixteenth International Conference for the students of Canada and the Eastern States closed at 10 p. m. In the opinion of men who have attended eight or ten consecutive sessions the present conference has been in many particulars the most successful ever held.

There were in attendance throughout the session 600 students, teachers, and guests. Of the number 592 were students representing 149 institutions in the eastern United States and Canada. This year has been notable on account of the number of foreign delegates present. The fact that 29 different countries have had representatives at the conference at some time during the session gives it a unique position among the student conferences of the world. These 92 student delegates have left for their home and will in a few weeks return to their colleges there to be in most cases mighty forces for the lifting up of the college life to a high and noble plane. Who can estimate the extent of the influence of those men filled with holy enthusiasm?

Following the custom of his father, Mr. W. R. Moody has issued the following call to the Christian Workers Conference from August 1st, to 18th:

DEAR FRIENDS AND FELLOW WORKERS:

With the beginning of the new century a deep and wide-spread interest has been manifested by Christians everywhere in a more extensive preaching of the Gospel. Many denominations and societies have made special efforts resulting in marked blessing while other organizations have sought to prepare the way for future united activity by calling Christians to prayer and Bible study.

There is every indication that during the coming season there will be increased effort with still greater blessing to the church and the world. Christians are united in the conviction that there is special and urgent need of the preaching of the Gospel. The religious and social conditions of our country never needed its influence and messages of freedom and hope more than now. No one will deny that God is ready to own the preaching of His Word and prepare servants to proclaim it. Both the Church and the nation are in danger from the temptations and evils of prosperity, which can be overcome only by the power of the Spirit through preaching the exceeding sinfulness of sin, the unfailing love and grace of God and the atoning death of Jesus Christ.

In extending an invitation to the Christian public to attend the nineteenth General Conference for Christian Workers to be held in Northfield this season, August 1 to 13, our earnest desire is that the gathering may be to all a preparation for effective work for Christ. In addition to the usual lecture on the Word of God, institutes on methods of work, and consecutive courses in Bible study, there will also be opportunities for the consideration of plans for evangelistic work at home and abroad during the coming year. Prominent and experienced pastors, evangelists, and missionaries will be present to assist with their counsel and inspiration.

In view of this special feature, we earnestly request the prayers of Christians everywhere for the success of this meeting and trust that as many as possible may come together with the spirit of Saviour Paul expressed in his letter to the Corinthians, 1 Cor. 2:2—"I determined not to know anything among you, save Jesus Christ and His crucified."
