Says Nobel Prize Should Be Awarded British Admiralty

NEW YORK, Dec. 18. — Humorist America's only original contribution to literature, declares Donald Ogden Stewart, the author, who suggests more of it as a remedy for the people who take life too seriously.

"What's the use of waiting until one has accumulated his pile before he begins to play?" he asks. "Let's have a lot of 'crazy fun' in acquiring the significant things, even the occasional and figurative 'sock in the eye.' Don't look for significance in everything.

The humorist is somewhat out of patience with the novelists who see only the dark side of American life.

"We are giving too much attention to books about people who have no fun," Stewart concludes. "My idea of an American story is one in which the guy has a good time. I started a serious novel once but I made things more troublesome for him so I gave it up."

Plans For Golf Unity in Canada

H. L. Anderson Makes Forceful Plea in Address Before Toronto Golf Country Club

TORONTO, Dec. 18. — In an address to the Western Golf and Country Club here tonight, H. L. Anderson, secretary of the Royal Canadian Golf Association, claims that the next few months will decide whether the present body, the Royal Canadian Golf Association, will continue to be the clearing-house for Dominion-wide golfing rules and regulations as in the case with old St. Andrews, to which all golfers of all portions of the British Isles give allegiance, or whether the golfers will allow the great distances which separate the various Provinces of Canada to sectionalize the activities and nullify the efforts which have been made to co-ordinate under one executive for the ultimate good of all.

In other words, Mr. Anderson claims, for the good of golf in Canada, that the parent body control golf in Canada, and frame rules for all provincial and inter-provincial amateur and professional meets.

In order to develop golf as it should be developed, Mr. Anderson claims that a championship of Canada should be a real Dominion title meet.

Mr. Anderson points out that a few years ago there were only 29 clubs in Canada, while now over 400 clubs function. One survey shows 1,000,000 Canadian golfers and \$125,000,000 invested in golf property.

Mr. Anderson concludes with a plea that every club throughout Canada take an active interest in and assume responsibility for the "Future of Golf in Canada."

GERMAN STREET CARS NOW CARRY MAIL BOXES

BERLIN, Dec. 17. — Letterboxes on street cars are an innovation in the German postal system. Boxes similar to those at the street corners are attached to the rear platform of trolley cars on lines which pass the main postoffice or important branches.

Persons desiring to mail a letter wait until the car comes along, step up behind and drop the missive in the box. As the cars pass the postoffice or branch the boxes are opened and emptied.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 18. — John Arthur Brown, chairman of the University of Pennsylvania and secretary of the American Rowing Association announced yesterday that the Association has officially established the Joseph Wright challenge trophy for 150 pound crews.

The trophy, a permanent one, is to be placed in competition at the American Rowing Association regatta, called the American Henley, on the Schuylkill River the last Saturday of May.

The establishment of the trophy is in recognition of the introduction of 150 pound crews by Joe Wright when he was head rowing coach at the University of Pennsylvania, and also for the "great contribution" to American rowing made by the veteran coach.
