"SUCH INTERESTING GLASSWARE"

There will be many exclamations this winter when discriminating women entertain. "Such interesting glassware" may be one of them. Factories all over the world have converted from war to peace and the market has caught up with the basic types of glassware needed, such as good sturdy tumblers and jelly glasses. Now the powers that be can become discriminating and competitive. You, in turn, can be selective. A calm hostess is a secure hostess, secure in the thought that she has sufficient glassware for emergencies and the right type of glassware as directed by social usage. Because there is a reaction from the hit and miss entertainings of the past, the social functions of this winter promise to be either more formal or casual with a studied casualness. The past word is the right thing in the right place at the right moment.

Stem Glasses Returns

For sit-down dinners, stem glasses will return. The fruit or fish cocktail and the goblet will be back in place. Before purchasing a goblet, lift it. See that it has balance and that the stem is neither too tall nor too short. See that the cocktail glass is wide enough at the bowl to allow the fish and cocktail sauce to be mixed well. The cocktail glass may rest on a matching glass plate or a plate matching the dinner service. For casual dinners served buffet style or on a bridge table, unstemmed glasses are preferred. These may have a frosted design, the Valley, or have frosted stripes on which you may write your guest's names. This avoids mixing the glasses in case of refill. For parties after a football game or barbeque parties where the cooking is done on your new roaster, the famous Tally-Ho set with its colorful scenes will please and intrigue your guests. These scenes are put on in such a way that you never fear that the color will wash off.

Colored Glasses

Speaking of color reminds me to comment on colored glasses. They make an attractive table and you will be safe in using them for a luncheon to which only women are invited. You may try sets in a combination of colors, including green, blue, amber and amethyst, but avoid using them when you have men. They like to see what they're drinking, even when it is only water. For intimate twosome dinners, there are glasses marked with "Mr." and "Mrs." These make excellent gifts to a new bride and a couple of longer standing, fine clear crystal of good shape and quality, which may be replaced easily, is preferred.

SHOW-OFF CHILD

There is a show-off in every class, and he makes the teacher a great deal of trouble with no compensating return. He cannot be too silly to win attention, cannot make enough of a nuisance of himself so long as he attracts attention. It is easy to say "Don't pay attention to him." One cannot help seeing and hearing and, worst of all, feeling him. This sort of child will drop his books with a crash when the class is concentrating on work so as to startle everybody in the room, stop the work and win attention. The fact that the attention he receives is an angry reproof from the teacher and a bored look from the class does not check him. He is happy. People looked at him and wondered. Of course, he does no worthwhile work in class. Only when the teacher stands beside him and prods him along does he get anything down on his work paper, and then it is not what it should be. His teacher says, "He can do the work if he will only concentrate on it." His mother says, "He can do anything he wants to do, but he just won't put his mind on it and he has a good mind."

There are people older than this child who, like him, dwell in childishness and crave attention. They are unhappy because they are not successful—not even in winning attention.

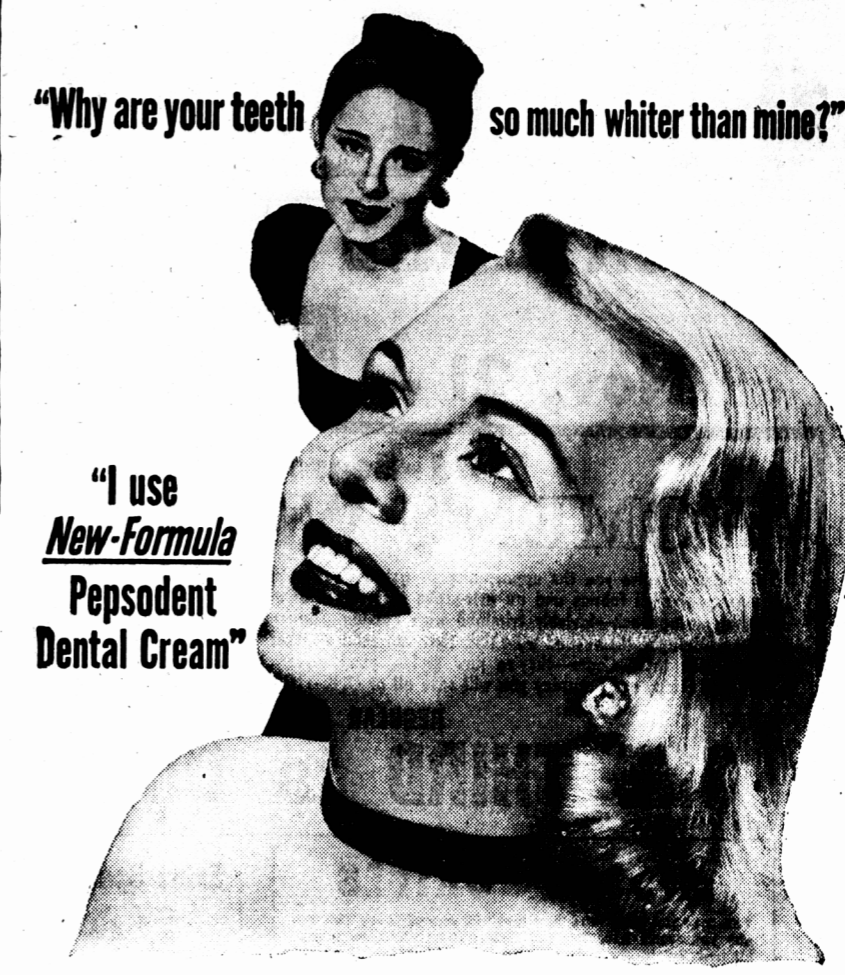
People avoid them. That is why the teacher is anxious about this show-off child—not so much because he is a nuisance in class as that he is likely to be a nuisance to himself in years to come. What is to be done to help him? He surely needs help.

Find some one thing he can do well. There is always something a child excels in. No matter how trifling a thing it is, pick it up and praise it to the family and to the neighbors. Make so much of it that this child begins to believe he really can do something and really is somebody. These children are usually in the lower I, Q section, perhaps by endowment, perhaps by neglected opportunities for growth. Start with the simplest, mechanical things and work up. These children fatigue early. When asked to study or work closely for more than five minutes, their minds shut down. They must have short lessons—sharp, pointed lessons—then a change to active work says Angelo Patri.

One such child seemed hopeless, but one day he washed the blackboard as it had never been done before and the teacher took hold from there. Once started, his timetable adjusted, he improved greatly. Such children must have special help.
