### A BOY OF GOD'S BRIGADE

Recently Mr. Moore wrote: "During the course of my travels have seen many fine things done by motorists... I have seen incidents which have made me feel ashamed... I saw 16 cars pass a soldier in near-zero weather on the Queen-Elizabeth Highway. Twelve contained only the driver. The 17th car picked up the lad. Hence the poem. My wife and I have had the honor of picking up 2,063 service men since the outbreak of war; of course I am fortunate that my work allows me to do this."

I saw him stand by the side of the road. A lonely soldier lad; Somebody's boy, he might be yours? Thumbing his way in the twilight hours. As the storm became quite bad, I stopped awhile and watched them pass. I was going the other way. And saw the car, so warm. Driving on in the darkening storm. Past somebody's boy that day.

I wanted to see if one would stop. To pick him up in the storm. "Look!" said my wife. "Christ stands today. He's thumbing. His way, Christ in a soldier's form."

Somebody's boy by the side of the road. Asked for a little aid. A boy who was willing his life to give. That ever selfish men might live. A boy of God's brigade.

Christ asks for help by the side of the road. Lift Him out of the storm. He's going your way, don't pass Him by. A boy perhaps like Him to die. For you and your car so warm.

### WORLD FRIENDSHIP

Who are our friends? Neighbors? Schoolmates? Any friends who live far away? Can you have friends whom we have never seen? Perhaps we have friends in foreign lands. Boys and girls in other lands have different clothing, maybe different customs, but all play, sing, study, even quarrel perhaps—just like Canadian children.

Can friends in different countries help each other, even without seeing each other?

Examples: Children in China tend silk-worms, from which our silk hair-ribbons are made. Children in Cuba work in cane-fields, and write list on the board. Bring out the fact that nations can only help nations by being friendly to each other. Application: Give example of the part boys and girls can take in the work of world-friendship and peace—consideration of brothers, sisters, chums, courtesy to neighbors, but an overgrown neighborhood quarrel, studying other countries and trying to understand their people better, friendly letters from children from mother countries.

### IT CAN BE DONE

The ministers and laymen of the Church can arrest the present tide and turn it in the opposite direction. Bishop Brooks once said, "Pray not for tasks equal to your strength, but for strength equal to your tasks." When we read in the New Testament such assertions as these: "the power of our resurrection," "nothing shall be impossible unto you," "Our weapons... mightily before God to the casting down of strongholds," are we aware of their atomic power?

Why do the leaders of our Church play the soft peddle in the matter of the increasing use of alcoholics by members of the Church? Why not take the lead in their conference and ask which is better, to let the liquor on their shelves pass into the veins of the young people, or to let it pour through the kitchen sink into the sewer? To take their liquor permits back to the Government stores for a fresh supply, or to take them to their local church and burn them there, before the Lord, as a sign of redemption of themselves to the service of God and His kingdom? Quotable? No, both right and possible. "According to your faith be it unto you." As striking things have happened in times of evangelical advance, and can happen again.

### "THEY PRAYED"

Jesus prayed all night and spent 40 days and nights in the wilderness in prayer. Moses was in the mountains 40 days, and his face shone so that he wore a veil. Expecting a guest or two for Sunday dinner? A meat loaf can be a toothsome way of providing the main dish. Seasoned meticulously, elasticized with crumbs of light steaming bread you're not wasting these days, and bound together with an egg, your pound purchase of ground meat will be a four-token bargain. In addition to Sunday dinner it should leave you with some cold slices for Monday. A simple but satisfying trick for meatless Tuesday would be to combine cooked macaroni or spaghetti with canned mushroom or tomato soup and gratings of nippy cheese. Of course, you won't forget the vegetable vitamins in crisp salad form which go best with it. A one token sausage purchase will give you a tasty meal on Wednesday, with perhaps an extra to garnish Thursday's lamb chop. Fish is scheduled for Friday. And a boost to your nutritional status will be given by Saturday's braised liver or kidney. Remarking from the week's ration will be two tokens, which can be YOUR contribution to save more meat for export to the hunger zones abroad.

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## PROHIBITION FORCE OUT

WASHINGTON—The weekly "clipsheet" of the United States Methodist Board of Temperance, which promoted the cause of prohibition for years but was abandoned in 1933, reappeared Saturday with a declaration that repeal "settled no problem."

"The time has come," wrote Denis Pickett, 60-year-old editor, of the problem and the prospect, policies of dealing with that problem to be reviewed. No harm can be done and much good may result, from the discovery and publication of the facts.

"The people have a right to know why there is so much drunkenness, so much crime, so much juvenile delinquency—why alcohol has become our 'fourth greatest health problem.'"

Meanwhile, in the United States Congress Representative Joseph Bryson (Dem.-S.C.) is rewriting an old Prohibition Bill of his to ban alcohol on the ground for food. Formerly it was based on manpower shortages during the war.

California urged a complete stoppage of production of distilled liquors for the next 120 days "if we really do to do everything that we can to help the starving."

The Prohibition Party has appeared in Pennsylvania. It polled enough votes to win standing as a party. In the May primaries will have candidates for Governor and other State offices.
