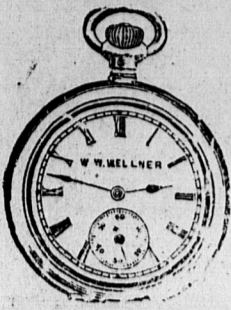

It is no use for any one to send these in, as they will not be shipped and it adds to the expense of packing and to the trouble of hauling them away again. Only good apples free from injury and of fair size will be shipped. It is hoped that Fruit Growers will pick them over carefully before bringing them in, because it is cheaper to pick them over at home than to have them picked over in Charlottetown.

If the present plan is carried out a missionary deputation consisting of Revs J. G. Bond and Mr Mortimer of Toronto, and Rev Mr Marshall, will visit this province about the first week in March in the interests of the Laymen's Movement in connection with the Methodist Church.
