In the Law Chambers in the case of Peerless Underwear Co. vs. Trainor, an application was made to set aside the declaration on account of an alleged irregularity in the name of the defendant. Fitzgerald J. made the order absolute holding that, while admitting the right of a plaintiff who has been wrongly named in the writ, to amend by correctly naming himself in the declaration, this was not a case coming within that rule, but rather one of substitution of a new plaintiff for some firm or thing not known to the law or capable of suing.
