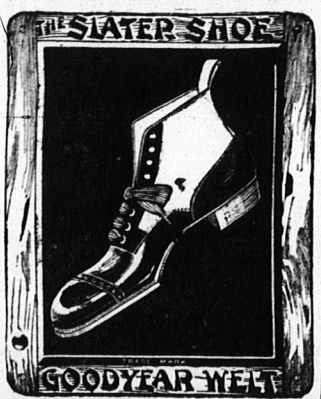

CAID MACLEAN'S FATE UNKNOWN

LANIER, August 14.—There is still much uncertainty here in the matter of the position of the Europeans in Morocco. No confirmation of the report that Caid Sir Harry MacLean, the Englishman in the service of the Sultan of Morocco, who has been a prisoner of the bandit Raisuli for more than six weeks has been released, can be obtained. A courier servant from MacLean has just arrived here and from him it is understood that the news of the bombardment of Casablanca by the French had made a bad impression on the Moroccan tribesmen, and caused the suspension of the negotiations for MacLean's release. The tribesmen are quite against all Christians, and wish to be revenged on MacLean, who is protected by Raisuli. The latest from MacLean is dated August 10th.

STANFORD WHITE'S WIDOW TO WED

New York, August 14.—Mrs. Stanford White, widow of the architect whom Harry Thaw shot to death last year, is engaged to marry, according to a rumor fully believed in their social circles. Her late husband's partner, Charles Follen McKim, is said to be the prospective bridegroom. The wedding, according to the report, will take place as soon as the trial of Harry Thaw is concluded and the sensation caused by the killing of Stanford White dies out.

The rumor of the engagement has been about for weeks, not only here, but in London and Paris, where Mr. McKim and Mrs. White, separately, have been visiting. Mr. McKim, when a cable sent by a newspaper correspondent asked him directly if he was to marry his late partner's widow, did not make any denial. Relatives of Mrs. White, also interrogated, smiled and said they did not know. Mrs. White was always an uncommunicative woman.

Everyone, however, who knows the widow of the slain architect and the head of the architectural firm of McKim, Meade and White, knows of the warm friendship that has always existed between them. After the tragic death ending her husband's life, Mr. McKim acted not only as business adviser, but as a personal counselor to the stricken woman.
