CONTOVERSARY OVER PARACHUTES  
LONDON, Aug. 14.—For many years the pilots of the Fleet, the officers of the late Lord Fisher, showed a disinclination to the use of parachutes. Admiral Jellicoe, who was in command of the fleet, was particularly anxious to maintain the tradition of the Navy. Admiral Jellicoe is now perturbed by the fact that the "Guardian" and "Pictorial" have published a sensational article stating that the British Admiralty will shortly be shut down for the want of parachutes. In the meantime he enquires the fact from a Canadian Air Colonel Barker, W. C., who stated that on two occasions pilots of enemy machines in the Italian front escaped by means of parachutes after he had shot down their aeroplanes, and added that if there was another war he would refuse to go up with one of these devices.

"Pilots and passengers, more particularly in military machines, will continue to use their parachutes, and will not be deterred by the fact that he was wrong when some years ago he said that parachutes were of no use, and, anyway, the pilots wouldn't use them," says Admiral Mark Keer.

Cure For Leprosy Is Discovered, Says Dr. F. F. Harris  
(Canadian Press)  
OTTAWA, Aug. 14.—A cure for leprosy, hitherto regarded as incurable, has been discovered, according to Dr. F. F. Harris, a medical missionary of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of Canada, who is home on furlough from Weihaiwei, Honan, China.

To a Canadian Press representative the doctor stated that a drug, called Epsosone, had been experimented with by French physicians and in one test made by a series of systematic injections, particularly on victims of the nodular type of leprosy 15 out of 18 were completely cured, while in another instance three cases out of three tests made were cured.

The doctor explained the nodular type of leprosy as being that which started by depriving the unfortunate victim of the use of their limbs. Complete cures had been effected in from five to six weeks according to the stages the disease had reached before the patients were submitted to the tests. Injections were made at intervals of from one to three days.

Dr. Carr-Harris is a former Kingston boy. He went to China in 1913 was invalided to England for special treatment in 1915 and on recovery served three years on the Western Front in the War. On discharge from the army he returned to China and is now in Canada on furlough.
