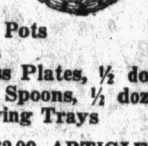

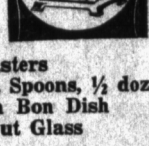

### "ASPIC JELLY"

A real Aspic calls for stock and the delicate flavors of vegetables and spices, the clear flavorful mixture brought to moulding consistency with the necessary amount of gelatin. The process is a delicate one—well worth knowing, of course, if you would make those fine little moulds of savory foods that are so infinitely attractive for special occasions.

With the help of that modern and useful invention, the bouillon cube or beef extract which comes in bottled form, we can take a short cut or emergency line in the making of a useful Aspic. To 4 cups of boiling water, add a cup of the vegetables that are most used for flavoring—say celery, onions and carrots, cut small. Continue to boil for 20 minutes, then add 1 bouillon cube for each cup of water used—4 of either in this case.

Soften 2 1/4 tablespoons gelatin in 1/2 cup cold water for 5 minutes. Add the gelatin to the bouillon, which should be at boiling point, and also add the juice of 1 lemon. Stir until gelatin is dissolved. Season the mixture highly with salt and a few drops tabasco or pinch cayenne. If you keep cooking sherry on hand, a little of it will add as much flavor to this emergency Aspic, as it does to a real Aspic.

Pour into wet moulds, to set and chill. Of course, any kind of diced meat or vegetables may be added to the jelly mixture, and with it, whatever might be suitable in the way of additional flavor touches, like thin slices of pickles or olives, a few capers, shredded peppers and so forth.

### Holly Berry Beliefs

As far back as the Fifth Century Christmas invested holly branches with a symbolism that helped to keep sacred memories alive. The crimson berries symbolized the blood shed on Calvary by the Founder of the Christian religion; the prickly leaves held remembrances of the crown of thorns; and the bitterness of the holly bark was symbolic of the draught of which Christ partook while hanging on the Cross. Once, in fact, there was a custom of making a decoction from the bark and drinking it in the midst of the Christmas celebrations, so that—in the words of an old writer—"Ye shall not forget the Cross as ye rejoice in the manger." — Montreal Herald.

### Ireland's Christmas

For the visitor there are two ways of spending Christmas in Ireland—alone or as one of a crowd. Anyone in search of a rest can find a beach lake or a mountain valley to which will be the only visitor. But he will not be lonely, for, in Ireland, the solitary stranger, if companionable, is adopted by the people and made free of their pleasant society. For those who prefer to be in the midst of typical Christmas enjoyment in the best modern spirit, Bundoran in Donegal, Loughrea (Kingswest) in Dub. Rossa in Wick, Westport, Benagh in Cork, Killybegs in Londonderry, are some of the places where there is plenty of life and movement at Christmas with golf, hunting and fine walking country at the door.

The Irish climate at Christmas is mild all over. The frozen spells that make the rest of Europe shudder rarely reach Ireland. If there is rain it is of the "soft sweet" variety of which the poet sang. "All you need are a raincoat and a pair of stout boots as a life preserver against the drizzle. That occasional drizzle keeps Ireland the "Emerald Isle."

In the "real" Irish parts of the country, where the ancient language is still spoken along with English, that is in Donegal, parts of Connaught, Kerry and Cork, and in a few other places you will see the old setting for Christmas unchanged. On Christmas night a lighted candle will burn in every window of the white-washed farmhouses. The farmer's children will be trying to count how many candlelights they can see from their own home. A larger candle will be set in a sod of turf or turp for holder. This will be the Christmas candle, to burn every night until the New Year.
