**WONDERING WHAT'S KEEPING
DADDY, CORK'S LORD MAYOR,
WHO IS ON HUNGER STRIKE.**

HEREBERT HOOVER
who spoke at the Canadian Red
Cross Dinner at Toronto, October
16th, on behalf of the British Em-
pire War Relief Fund to combat
disease and distress in the war-
stricken areas of Europe. Mr.
Hoover was American Food Ad-
ministrator during the war, and
was Director-General of Relief in
Europe for the Allies and Associ-
ated Governments after the Armis-
tice. It was Mr. Hoover's discern-
ing genius which organized the
saving meal a day of fat, sugar and
milk for Belgian children during
the occupation. After the Armis-
tice Mr. Hoover organized the
European Children's Relief Admi-
nistration, whereby, at its maximum,
about 3,500,000 children in some
twelve of the liberated countries
received one supplementary meal a
day to bring them through into
normal growth and health.
Mr. Hoover commended very
earnestly the Canadian Red Cross
Appeal for funds to fight disease
and to save the children in the war-
stricken poorer countries of Europe.
He said that the American Child-
ren's Relief Administration in
Europe would operate in every
possible way to aid in the distribu-
tion of supplies for the children
through approved national and
local agencies in the name of the
Canadian Red Cross.
