

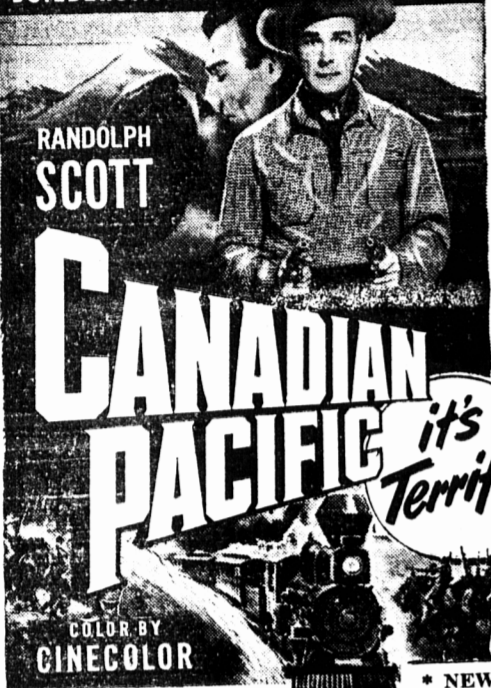

YOUNG POLISH D.P. FEATURED IN NFB'S MINING FILM "VALLEY OF GOLD"

Willie Czalkowski, a young Polish D.P. recently arrived in Canada, has discovered that the life of a movie star need not be very different from the routines of less glamorous professions. Chosen for a principal part in the National Film Board release "Valley of Gold," Willie found himself working the same hours and doing the same things he would normally do in an ordinary miner's day.

In "Valley of Gold" Willie plays himself, a young immigrant who has come to Canada to work in one of the gold mines of the Val D'Or region in northern Quebec. The NFB camera follows Willie in a typical miner's work day, viewing through his eyes the story of a modern frontier mining town. Glances of night life and flashbacks to early prospective days reveal, through the fresh viewpoint of newcomer Willie, an indication of the rapid development of the country and its power to produce.

With the first snow, the youngsters were once again taking advantage of the hills for coasting. However, although all are only too glad to have the children enjoy themselves, the danger to themselves by coasting on only is there danger of striking a vehicle, but they themselves may be run over, since coasting makes the highway so slippery, and cars are likely to lose control. There being such danger to the children, the idea came to Mr. Lorne Winton to provide private coasting hills for the children and through the generosity of Mr. Jack Anear and Mr. Joseph Vuozzo, the necessary fields were acquired to make the coasting hills. The first one is on the Lower Montague Road, and runs towards the shore; the second on Mr. Vuozzo's property runs towards the creek. The Poole and Beer construction company very kindly donated the services of the bulldozer and other equipment so as to make a runway some thirty-three feet wide, and over four hundred yards long. It is hoped that in view of the generosity of the donors of the fields, and of the Poole and Beer company, that the children will use these runways, and keep off the main streets where they are endangering their own lives, and those of many motorists.
