—The steamer Ryhope took on board at Summerside 3200 bars of oats, 110 sheep, 23 head of cattle and a lot of butter. She will sail when the weather clears.

—The Miacmac football team have been photographed by Mr Bowness of Summerside. The fifteen players, including Urban Gillis, are nicely arranged with Rev John A. McDonald and Chief Bernard in the centre.

—The exterior of the Lennox Island church has been repainted this fall. The color is stone gray with white trimmings and reflects credit on Fred Farrant and his capable assistants who performed the work.

—Rev P. P. Arsenault of Mount Carmel has had constructed one of the most complete and up-to-date poultry houses in the Maritime Provinces. It is fifty feet long by sixteen wide, with concrete floors, good ventilation, roosts, nests, etc.

—The Empress arrived in Summerside, yesterday morning at six a.m. There was quite a number of passengers. The mails and passengers for the east went forward by the regular morning train at nine a.m.

—Much sympathy is expressed for H. R. and Mrs Crockett, Summerside, in the death of their infant daughter Marjorie Kleanor, six months old. The death occurred yesterday at two p.m. The funeral will take place to-day at two p.m. from their residence, Central Street.

—The Hon John Richards has disposed of his oyster area, situated between East Bideford and Lennox Island, to a syndicate composed of Mr Burleigh and the Sharp Bros, Franklin, Shelton, and Willard. The reported price of \$8000.00 which was paid for it indicates the value of the haul.

—The high tide yesterday carried away a large baling house belonging to Captain J. L. Read, Summerside. As it sailed away out towards the entrance of the harbor it kept on an even keel, in building it the Capt. is, no doubt, provided it with ballast so that it would keep right side up on land or at sea.

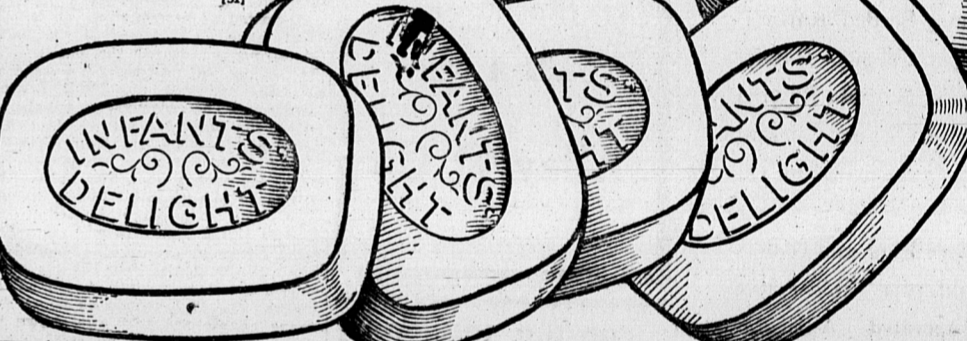

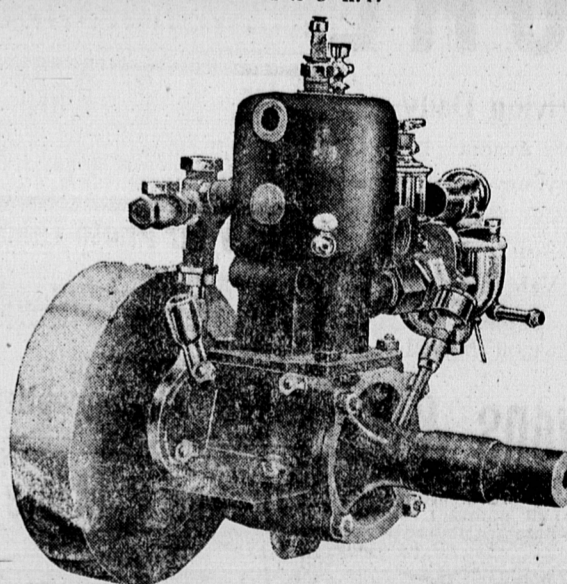

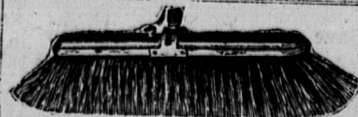
