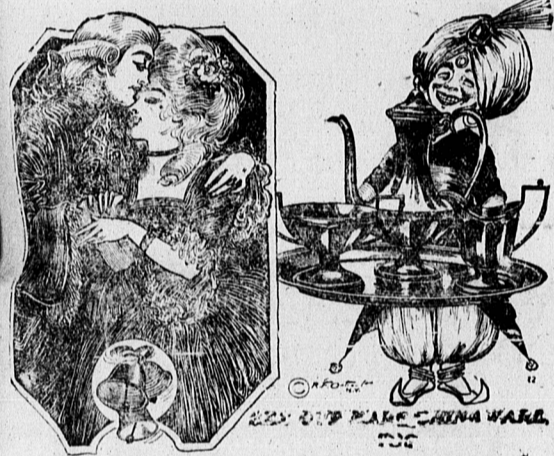

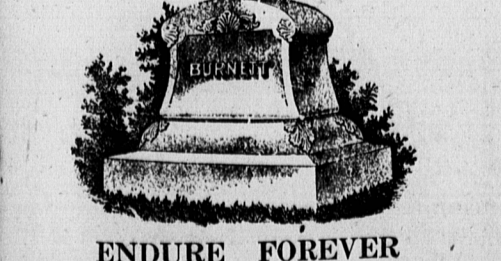

Ramsay MacDonald

On Church And State

(By Dominion News Service.)

LONDON, June 14.—Ramsay MacDonald, M.P., speaking in London on the relations between Church and State, said he was one of the last people to decry the State, but the State had its bounds, and there was a large part of life that must always remain outside its sphere. In the very nature of religion there must be voluntarism.

No man could be religious by Act of Parliament. The life of religion was liberty. Therefore when they asked the State to extend its protecting arm over them they sacrificed religion to the organization. An established church tended to promote indifference to religion. It tended to promote formality, respectability and worldliness. What vain piece of folly, he asked, was held enough to say that the religious life of Wales today was more degraded than it was four years ago because there was no longer an Established Church in Wales?

One of the most promising signs of a true spiritual revival was to be found in certain sections of the Church of England. He did not believe any of those men placed any value at all upon the Established Church as an aid to their religious duties. There is a strong secularizing process in the State, he continued. Whatever the State touches, it do not think that the Church of England is to vitalize matter and touch it spirit. It is rather to solidify spirit and make it matter. I come more and more to the conclusion that the politician is weak and that public opinion is strong, that law is weak and that conscience is wonderful, that the House of Commons is a mere erection of bricks built upon the sands, and that the character of our people, made, tempered and tried, is the great thing that decides what the laws should be, how they are to be kept, and whether they are beneficent in the common interest.

KOREA IS STIRRED BY BOMB PLOTS

TOKYO, June 11.—"The Land of Morning Calm," has belied its name of late, Morning, night and noon, it has been anything but calm. It has been a dull day, indeed, when the Japanese police haven't reported another bomb plot in Korea, or announced the arrest of another bunch of "Korean socialists."

The Korean Independence Party, which seems to operate principally from Shanghai, and whose known members would be arrested the moment they set foot in Korea, has been responsible—according to Japanese police—for a general revolutionary plot in Korea, to have materialized this year, but which the police say they have nipped in the bud.

Throughout Korea, and on the Japanese mainland, there have been very many arrests of Korean suspects. In a good many cases bombs or bomb-making equipment were found.

You have at all times set an example which has been an incentive and an inspiration to us all. On all occasions and under all circumstances you have taken and carried the burden in all the departments of church work.

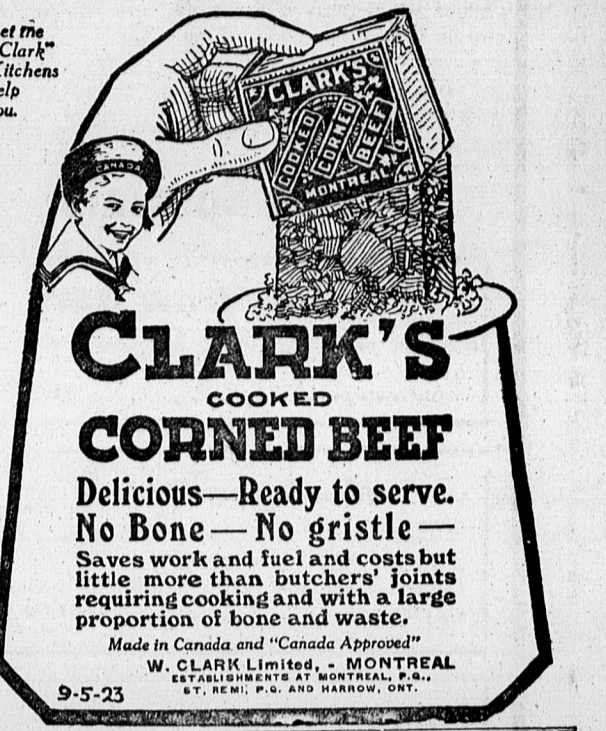
