THE KIRK OF ST. JAMES

Preaching yesterday morning from the Kirk pulpit on the text "Make Me As One of Thy Hired Servants" (St. Luke 15:19), the minister, Rev. T. H. Russell Somers said: "Yet wasn't there some worthiness in the Prodigal's longing? Yes, and we must clearly trace and understand the worthiness. But we must first understand that He was not born to be a slave. No two faces are alike, no two fingerprints, no two souls. That fact makes every book a different book. That fact gives portrait painting its 'lift' and all friendship its joy. Man is interested in mass production (far too interested) but God apparently is interested only in individuals. No two blades of grass are alike, no two stars, no two men. Each man is his own man, and because he did not make himself, each man is God's own man. When the Prodigal said, or proposed to say to his father, 'I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight' he proved himself more than a prodigal and forever more than a slave. He knew that in his folly he had done more than tear his own clothes; he had torn the garment of the sky. He had stained more than his own flesh; He had stained heaven. Therefore, even in the knowledge of his sins, he was more than a man - he was a child of the sky. The man is a man, not a slave, and he must be free."

Hotels, restaurants, and other quota users are permitted to continue serving these commodities in the regular course of their business, but may not buy or accept delivery of supplies during the period of suspension.

INDUSTRIAL USERS...

Industrial users such as bakers, confectioners, etc., likewise cannot purchase or accept delivery of supplies of these commodities during the period of suspension.

WHOLESALE AND RETAILERS...

This Temporary Freezing Order does not interfere with the normal flow of these products to wholesale and retail distributive channels.
