FIRE AND ACCIDENT IN SYDNEY.

SYDNEY, Oct. 11.—Following close upon the serious loss of the fire of Saturday which resulted in the almost total destruction of the interior of the Marlin Commercial building, Bates Block which adjoins the Carlin Block was badly gutted on Sunday. The fire had gained considerable headway by the time the firemen arrived and the lower portion of the interior was a mass of flames. The fire started in the rear of Scott's, wholesale stationery store, and burned through to the front of the store destroying the entire stock. The total loss will amount to about \$20,000, including building and stock. The Johnstone Piano Co., on the first floor, also lost heavily, a number of pianos and other instruments being completely destroyed. Harry Ritchie, a boy of 16, was accidentally shot while on a shooting trip. While Ritchie was sitting with his gun lying at his side his foot struck the lock causing the rifle to go off. The bullet entered his side.
