The Ministers' Conference of the United Baptist Churches of New Brunswick began its sessions in the Baptist church, Newcastle, Monday evening, Rev. D. Hutchinson, D. D., St. John, well known in this province was elected president of the Conference.

Rev. J. J. McCaskill, pastor of St. Matthew's Presbyterian Church, was expected to leave this morning for a four weeks vacation to be spent in a camping trip in the Alleghash region in Maine. During his absence St. Matthew's church and the Congregational church will hold union services with Rev. H. S. Mahood, pastor of the Congregational church, in charge preaching in the morning in St. Matthew's and evening in the Congregational church.—St. John Exc. Mr. McCaskill is well known in Charlottetown.

The Quebec Steamship company's steamer Trinidad sailed yesterday for Quebec via Charlottetown and Gaspe with about 150 American tourists on board. The Trinidad was fourteen hours late when she arrived Monday evening from New York, having been held up by the seamen's strike in that city. The Trinidad discharged ten inexperienced hands taken on at New York as strike-breakers and substituted ten firemen and others from Halifax before leaving port. The fast steamer will make four trips to Halifax and New York this summer, returning here in a week's time from Quebec. The officers are: Captain J. A. McKenzie, chief officer, C. A. Gladwin, chief engineer, C. C. Evans, surgeon, Dr. Keblum.

Preparations for the government marine survey work in Hudson Bay are now well under way. The steamer Arctic left Quebec last week fully equipped for the work, while the Minty, which arrived from Charlottetown some time ago, came off the stocks at Dartmouth Monday and is now provisioning up for the four months voyage. She is under the command of Captain Murehison and is expected to get away by the fifteenth of the present month with a full staff of government engineers and surveyors accompanying her. The third of the fleet to operate in the great northern inland sea is the Boethic, which is now sailing down the St. Lawrence from Montreal. These ships have a full equipment, including a number of whale boats, motor launches, as well as lifeboats, for the long stay in the north and will land large quantities of supplies at Fort Churchill and Nelson. About sixty passengers are on the Boethic going on hunting trips to the Bay.
