Reformed Churches In Convention

WORLD ALLIANCE TO GATHER IN THE HUB JUNE 16 (Boston Post, May 25th.) Delegates from all over the world, representing more than 43,000,000 of the Christians holding the Presbyterian doctrine, will convene in First Presbyterian Church, Boston, June 16, for sessions until and including June 26 of the quadrennial general council of the world's alliance of reformed churches.
 More than 300 notables are to attend and the Rev. Dr. Charles Merle d'Aubigne of Neuilly-sur-Seine, France, the retiring president of the council, will preside.

THIRD IN AMERICA

This will be the third council held in the United States, the last one being that in Pittsburgh in 1921. Cardiff, Wales, was the meeting place in 1925.

Next to the Catholics, the various Presbyterian bodies constitute the largest and most powerful of the sects in Christianity. There are 43,000 congregations, 100 central bodies, and more than 9,000,000 full communicants; apart from infants, 43,000,000 worship according to Presbyterian doctrine.

Local Presbyterians are busy preparing accommodations, and Dr. Watson, official host, has his church home ready for the guests. The Rev. Dr. J. W. S. Lewry of the old Scottish Church, Cambridge, who as a lad attended with his father the meeting of the first council, in Edinburgh, a half-century ago, is interested keenly and anticipates meeting many old friends.

Among the lands to be represented in the Boston council are the various Presbyterian bodies and United Church in the United States and Canada; the Church of Scotland; United Free Church of Scotland; Presbyterian Church of England; Presbyterian Church in Ireland; Presbyterian Church of Wales; Free Church of Scotland; Original Secession Church of Scotland; Reformed Presbyterian Church of Scotland; Reformed Church in Austria; Reformed Church in Belgium; Evangelical Church of Czech Brethren (Bohemia); Magyar Reformed Church in Slovakia; Evangelical Reformed Churches of France; Union of Evangelical Churches of France.

Greek Evangelical Synod, German Reformed Bund; Reformed Church in Hungary, Magyar Reformed Church in Rumania, Magyar Reformed Church in Jugoslavia, Waldensian Church in Italy, Reformed Church in Lithuania, Reformed Church in Switzerland, Reformed Church in Holland, Dutch Reformed Church in South Africa, Presbyterian Church in South Africa, Reformed Church of South Africa, Presbyterian Church of Australia and Presbyterian Church of New Zealand. Others are expected from South America, and, literally, the leaders of the flocks in the ends of the earth will foregather here in council.

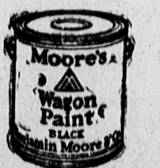

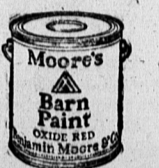

ERROR MAKES STAMP RARE

SLAY STONE EATING GERMS

Chemical warfare is being waged on germs that are literally eating up big buildings. Scores of organisms that eat stone and other substances have been discovered. Chemicals are sought that will slay the germs without destroying the material. The germs open the pores in the surface, exposing the material to the destructive influence of the weather. Some bacteria cause erosion in the hardest marble in three weeks.
