Down East."

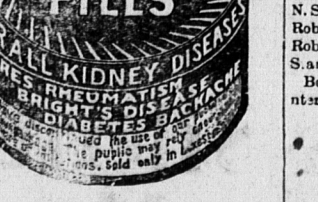
\$50,000.000 FOR ADVERTISING.
