A SCHOOL exhibition will be held in connection with Prince Street School in September. The children during the holidays will collect specimens of natural history, objects, botanical, geological, etc., etc. There will also be an exhibition of school work in connection with above.

THERE will be a meeting of those interested in inter-scholastic sports at Prince of Wales College on Saturday after the session of the Manual Training School to arrange a program and other matters in connection with the sports to be held in September after the re-opening of the schools.

But he exhorted them to carry out the last clause, viz: To keep themselves unspotted from the world. The Foresters' Constitution and Order is a noble one—a precious legacy from your forefathers to you. It will go down honored to your children and children's children as generations yet unborn shall enjoy its privileges as you have done. The preacher concluded an eloquent and powerful sermon by saying:

A CORRESPONDENT in Sydney sends the GUARDIAN the following taken from the Toronto World:—The latest news in regard to the fast Atlantic service is that Mr. Whitney is to build the fleet and that the Vanderbilt interests are to furnish the necessary railway connection between Sydney and New York. Whether this news is correct or not we do not know, but the story is not at all improbable. It shows us, at any rate, that the great possibilities of Sydney as an ocean port, have been noised abroad, and we can confidently hope that it will not be long in any event until capitalists come forward and take advantage of its unique natural facilities. Sydney is indeed a much favored place. It is a seaport possessing an excellent and capacious harbor. It is about 1000 miles nearer Southampton than New York. It is open for practically the whole year round, and it has no dangerous approaches. In addition to being a seaport, Sydney is destined to become a great manufacturing city. It is the centre of a big coal industry. Its iron and steel plant has already gained a world-wide reputation. We have this remarkable combination of advantages at Sydney; the ships necessary for the fast Atlantic service can be built there; they can be supplied by the Sydney coal mines with all the fuel required while crossing the ocean; finally, Sydney is by long odds the nearest American port to Europe. No other seaport on the continent possesses such exceptional advantages. These advantages have at last been brought to the attention of United States capitalists and we may rest assured that if Mr. Whitney and the Vanderbilts have not decided to exploit the fast Atlantic project it will not be long till other big railways magnates and capitalists do so.

FOUND AFTER 18 YEARS.

NEW YORK, June 5—Miss C. H. Ferris, of Brooklyn, has identified at an undertaker's the body of Oliver H. Ferris as her brother, a Yale man of 1887, who disappeared eighteen years ago and was searched for in many institutions. Financial ruin caused his disappearance. Before his death he had for ten years been a clerk for the Pennsylvania railroad without his family knowing where he was.
