**Recover At N. Y.**

(By Victor Eubank)

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—(AP)—Short covering and buying by professionals brought selective recoveries in today's stock market although most brokerage customers continued to hold aloof and many leading issues failed to revive.  
Four traders were on the selling side at a fast opening. The pace soon slowed as commitments were reinstated here and there. Associated steels, coppers, oils and specialties recovered after midday. Gains of fractions to 2 points or so for favorites were well distributed at the close but minus signs predominated.  
Canadian issues were lower. McIntyre took a sharp 1 1/8 drop while Hiram Walker lost 1-8. Dilliers Seagrams was down 1-2.  
On the curb, Lake Shore was down 1-8 and Giant Yellowknife was inactive.  
Mission Corp. and Pacific Western Oil, soft Wednesday in reflection of opposition to the Sunray merger, did an about-face. The former was up 2 at 49 1/2 and the latter 1-8 at 49 1/4. Wesson Oil was up 2 5/8 at 50.  
Curtiss-Wright "A" was up 1/4 at 20 1/2, a 1947 peak, still spurred by the company's call for tenders for this stock. American Smelting was a strong spot, up 1 1/2 at 8, while Youngstown Sheet advanced 1 1/4 at 78 1/2. After the close American Smelting directors voted a stock dividend in addition to a cash payment of \$1.50 a share on the common.  
N. Y. and Harlem Railroad, an odd lot issue was off 10 points at 245 on a few trades. Pennsylvania Railroad touched a new low since 1940 and finished off 1-8 at 107-8. Other lagards were Sears Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft, North American, International Nickel, General Electric, J. S. Penney, Southern Railway and Great Northern Railway.

**Mining Stocks**

**Lively But Trend Down At Montreal**

MONTREAL, Nov. 6.—(CP)—Selected industrials were about mixed in moderately active dealings on the stock exchange and curb market here today. Mines were very lively but a negative trend was in evidence.  
Closing index averages indicated banks up .05 to .27, utilities off .1 to .78, industrials unchanged at 125.5, papers up 1.45 to 372.75, and golds unchanged at 77.74. Volume was 53,300 industrial shares and 35,900 mining shares.  
International and Consolidated were active in papers, ahead 1 at 30 and 1-8 at 19 7/8, respectively. Brown Pfd. went ahead 1 5/8 at 107 and Donnacona 1-8 at 4. Brown Common, with a turnover of 9,182 shares, dropped 3-8, while M and O lost 1-2 at 23 and Price 1-4 at 6.  
In utilities, Winnipeg Electric added 1-4 at 20 1/2 and Bell lost 1/2 at 173 3/8. In beverages, Canadian Breweries added 1-4 at 24. Homestead dropped 1-4 at 6.5 but Homestead dropped 1-4 at 6.5. Algoma, with a turnover of 1,375 shares, drove ahead 2 1/4 points in steel while Atlas added 1-8 at 12 5/8. Argus was up the minimum fraction in the finance group. Other industrial losers included Alcohol "B", 1-4, and Brand and Millen "A" five cents. Dosco "A" was a gainer, ahead 3-8 at 16 5/8. "Big leader" in the mines today was Quebec, Managaw, which touched a new high of 170, and rose 17 cents on a turnover of 179,156 shares. Also active were Central Cadillac and Bob's Lake, off 2 cents on a turnover of 21,200 shares and 4 cents on a turnover of 45,550 shares, respectively.  
Vinray went ahead 2 cents and Beatrice 1 1/2, while Band-Ore lost 7/16, Edonia 5, East Sullivan 5. Trading box score: Stocks traded 185, higher 57, lower 63, unchanged 65, new highs 7 and new lows 7.

**Price Lower On Toronto Exchange**

TORONTO, Nov. 6.—(CP)—Pices were lower in the Toronto stock exchange today but recovery tendencies in stepped-up action toward close reduced earlier losses substantially for golds while western oils moved into the gain side. Base metals alone failed to join the upward trend.  
Western oils picked up toward close on gains for Anglo-Canadian, Cuyaga and Edmonton Home Oil, Roxana and Royaltite.  
Junior golds lost the buoyancy characteristic of the first three days of this week. A special generally drifted downward. Hogo continued the feature of a turnover of about 100,000 shares and Central Petroleum about \$3,000. Amalgamated Larder was down 20 cts at 38 with other junior golds. K. J. Aquarius, Armistice, Caribou, Caribou, Consolidated, Beatrice, Dickenson, East Malartic, Glenora, Keno Hill, Negus, Ogama, San Antonio, Sisco, Seniors were down for Bulador, Dome and Hollinger in fractions but up for Acacia at \$4.45 and Sigma 10 at \$3.35.  
Base metals were soft with the majority trading down at close including Hudson Bay 1-4 at 43 1/2, International Lead 1/4 at 6 at 50, Labrador Oil at 55 1/2, Mayfield 1/4 at \$2.55, Noranda 1-4 at 46 1/4, Quomont 1-4 at 15 1/8, Sleep Rock 4 at \$2.31.
