URGES CAREFUL

A complete system of social insurance to cover old age, sickness, and accident and embrace persons not covered by the unemployment insurance act, and other present social services was urged by George Ross (Lib. Calgary East) who defended the plebiscite as the proper course.

While these views were expressed in the debate on the speech from the throne by Premier Mackenzie King gave the House a brief preview of the legislation to be asked to pass this session. The first measure after the present debate will provide for the taking of the plebiscite.

Other measures of the session will largely relate to the war effort and post-war conditions. They will deal with war appropriation bills, which marketing, land settlement, borrowing, debt refunding, and possibly amendments to the army, naval and air force laws.

A parliamentary committee will be set up to study redistribution which takes place every 10 years following the holding of a census. Mr. King announced the government has agreed to the appointment of ministers in Ottawa to represent Poland, Norway and Yugoslavia.

Mr. Moore quoted Italian authorities on the relation of the executive to the legislature in Fascist Italy and said it involved a structural change in the system of the government.

"The assumption of power to legislate by order-in-council in certain matters has already been considered by the executive body," he said. "But structural change" came in Italy. It has come to Canada, it is coming everywhere with the quantity and quality of the measures.

He then turned to the order-in-council establishing price control in Canada and expressed his amazement that such a measure should be enacted by the executive and not referred to Parliament. He said it was a "totalitarian" measure. The wealth of Canada among the citizens.

Mr. Moore drew applause from Conservative members as he proceeded with his criticism of the exercise of power by the executive and by boards created by it. He said he had opposed the national election because he thought it meant one-party government, and democracy in a government in the face of opposition.

"I confess I feel as though I had escaped from the regime of a one-party system only to fall into the deep blue sea of order-in-council," he said.
