IMPERIAL POLITICS.

British political affairs have seldom if ever been in greater confusion than at present. The King's speech at the opening of Parliament gave no clear view of the attitude of the Government upon many questions in regard to which the people desire to be informed. In fact the Government policy cannot be very definite or consistent at a time when such serious divisions exist within the Cabinet. There is a note of uncertainty on all sides. It is impossible for the party to have a clear mind when the leaders are thus divided. In fact the Liberal Unionist party is split into half a dozen different groups, which are only held together by the loosest of ties and ready at any moment to fly apart.

And if the ministerial party is thus divided, it is to be observed that there is a growing antagonism to the Government in the Irish party, while the Liberals have by no means healed their differences. The one gleam of light is found, strange to say in the coming retirement of Sir William Vernon Harcourt, because, although a man of conspicuous ability, his removal prepares the way for a reconstruction of the party. He could neither secure the leadership himself, nor help the party to another leader upon whom they could unite. It is intimated that with Harcourt's retirement Lord Rosebery may again become the Liberal leader in place of Campbell-Bannerman, who has not been even moderately successful in making the most of ministerial dissensions.

The fiscal question is not to be taken up during the current session, and neither one of the ministerial factions can tell whether Mr. Balfour's policy of retaliation or the full measure of protection advocated by Mr. Chamberlain will in the end be the policy adopted. The recent by-elections have gone against the Government. The educational question still troubles both parties and would make for the strength of the Opposition if they could harmonise their difficulties. In fact both parties are entirely at sea. This is doubly unfortunate in view of the complications possible to arise out of the eastern war. Fortunately the country has a certain pretty well-grounded confidence in the cool head and cautious temper of Lord Lansdowne, the Foreign Minister. A strong Government with a clear-cut and well-defined policy in both domestic and international affairs ought now to be at the head of affairs, but such a policy neither the Ministerial nor the Opposition party is at present ready to offer to the country.

THE STRENGTH OF PARTIES.

The Legislative Assembly which is now shortly to hold its fourth and last session was elected on 12th December, 1900. The thirty members then elected were divided in the proportion of twenty-three Liberals and seven Conservatives, but this was

changed to twenty-two and eight by the seating of Mr. McKinnon in the place of Mr. Bruce for the Fourth District of

King's County. By subsequent by-elections of 9th December 1902, Dugald Currie, Conservative was chosen in the Second District of Queens to succeed Hon. D. Farquharson, Liberal, who resigned to become a candidate for the Commons, and W. A. O'Morson Conservative was elected to succeed Hon. Malcolm McDonald, Liberal, deceased, in the Third District of Kings. This made the strength of parties, Liberals twenty; Conservatives ten.

There are now three vacancies, one caused by the resignation of Hon. J. F. Whear, as member for Charlottetown, another, in the Second District of Kings, caused by the acceptance of office by the sitting member, Anthony McLaughlin. These seats, both held by Liberals here before, are to be filled at the by-elections to be held to-day. The third vacancy, caused by the demise of the late J. E. McDonald in the Third District of Kings, will be filled at a by-election to be held on March 20th. Should there be no change in the political complexion of these seats as the result of the by-elections the strength of parties will be twenty Liberal and ten Conservative. Should the Liberals carry them all the result would be a relative strength of twenty-one to nine, whereas should the Conservatives carry all three seats they would increase their strength to twelve as against eighteen remaining Liberals. It seems not improbable that honors may be divided. In any case the Government seems assured of at least a good majority down to the close of the legislative term.

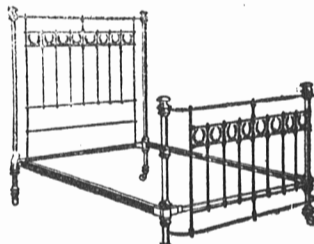
