Literature And Life By bookman "RIZPAH" - A STUDY IN MOTHERHOOD

Former P. E. I. Man Dies In Victoria, B. C.

Dr. S. J. Willis, Native Of Kingston, Was Prominent Educationist.

The following was taken from the Victoria Daily Times, Victoria, B.C. and appeared in the April 24 edition: Dr. Samuel J. Willis, chairman of Victoria College Council, a man according to Education Minister G.M. Weir who "left the impress of his personality and vision on the school system of British Columbia to a greater extent than any educationist who served the province since the time of its formation in 1871," died today at St. Joseph's Hospital. He was 70 years of age.

Dr. Willis had served as superintendent of education for the British Columbia government for 26 years from 1919 when he was drafted from the principalship of Keesler High School in Vancouver. He was appointed deputy minister of education for the province in 1928 when the deputy ministry was created. In 1945 Dr. Willis retired from the provincial government service on superannuation.

Born in Prince Edward Island in 1877, Dr. Willis taught in a one-room school there for a short time before proceeding to McGill University where he graduated with honors in classics in 1900 with a B.A. degree. After teaching in a Montreal high school for a short time he came to British Columbia. His first British Columbia school was in the old Boys' Central School in Victoria where he started teaching in 1909. From that school he proceeded to Victoria High School of which he became principal in 1908.

Leaving Victoria High School in 1916, Dr. Willis joined the staff of the University of British Columbia. He served for a year as assistant professor of classics, before accepting the position of principal of King Edward High School in Vancouver.

Honored By Universities Dr. Willis was twice honored by Canadian Universities. In 1921 McGill University conferred an honorary doctor of laws degree on him and in 1946 from the University of British Columbia. Dr. Willis received a similar honorary LL.D. degree.

Dr. Willis had served as grand master of the Masonic Grand Lodge of British Columbia and president of the Canadian Education Association, of which he was an honorary life member.

The last major work with the education department for Dr. Weir was the helping with the drafting of amendments based on the Camson Report on education finances which were adopted by the provincial Legislature during the 1946 session.

Dr. Willis served on the Victoria College Council with J.G. Rutland and W.T. Strath, K.C., Victoria M.L.A., as provincial government appointees.

At the time he received the honorary LL.D. degree from the University of B.C., Dr. Willis was feted by graduates and friends many of whom were his former students.

"No teacher was ever held in higher esteem by his old students than Dr. Willis," said Dr. Weir. He was an outstanding teacher, an outstanding administrator with a great strength to inspire confidence in his subordinates and all of those he was associated with," he said.

He is survived by his wife, living in Victoria, and one son, Philip Willis in Winnipeg.

Dr. Willis was son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Charles Willis of Kingston, P.E.I.

Three brothers, Bertram Willis, Robert Willis and Frank Willis reside at Kingston. Another brother, Hubert Willis, who resided on the old homestead, passed away in 1929. A sister, Mrs. John (Minnie) Green of Kingston also predeceased him by a number of years.
