THE CAPITAL OF THE WEST

Latest From Summerside and Prince County.

SUMMERSIDE was fairly well represented at the public meeting in Market Hall last evening to hear Mr. Maxwell, C. E. talk on estimates of water works and sewerage. Mayor McNeill presided.

Mr. Maxwell said he was here at the instance of the Town Council and not to promote a scheme. He first referred to water works and sewerage being as old as civilization and the towns which had not a system were simply marking time. He went over Mr. Lea's estimates submitted some years ago. There were pretty close figures and little saving could be made today. In some instances the cost might be a little heavier while other expenses could be considerably lessened; perhaps on the whole a system could be put in for about \$10,000 less than Mr. Lea's figures. He would recommend a smaller stand pipe; about town smaller pipes could be used while auxiliary engines might be done away with and two eight inch main pipes be used instead of one twelve inch main. He was in favor of combining surface draining with the sewerage system. He thought a system in Summerside would be self-sustaining in five years.

In answer to questions asked by several citizens present Mr. Maxwell thought that with a system here insurance rates would eventually be lowered, while to one who carries their own insurance would feel much safer. He explained to how cellars could be drained into the sewerage, how there would be no danger from frost, the cost of connecting houses; how it would be an easy matter to borrow sufficient money, etc. Mr. Maxwell told how North Sydney, which put in water works and sewerage in 1896 when with about the same population as Summerside had now a system which was self-sustaining; and a system could be put in here at a much lower cost on account of easier excavations. In customary, he said, to put in water works first and sewerage would follow.

A unanimous vote of thanks was tendered Mr. Maxwell by the audience.

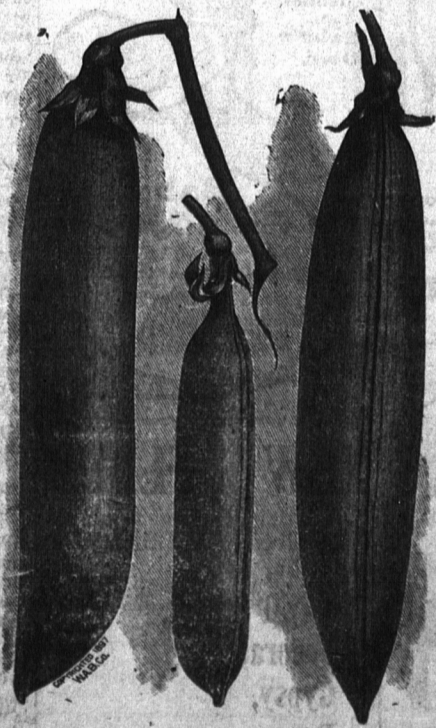
