LONDON, July 4—(AP)— The Stock Exchange continued cheerful today on encouraging war news from Russia, together with good progress on other fronts, but the demand remained rather subdued in general. South African golds met keen inquiry from Johannesburg.

WINNIPEG, July 4—(CP)— United Kingdom interests continued in the market for Canadian wheat today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange and transfers credited them with taking 500,000 bushels of No. 1 and 2 northern.

TORONTO, July 4—(CP)— The gold stocks put on an old-style bull market today, posting wide gains on heavy volume. Profit-taking cut the gains in the final period. Late in the day the Base Metal Stocks came to the front and they netted an index gain of 1.40.

MONTREAL, July 4—(CP)— Current buoyancy in paper, industrial and golds was maintained today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market and indices for these groups were pegged higher. Volume was the best recently.

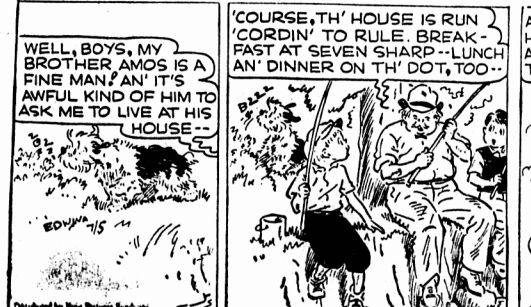

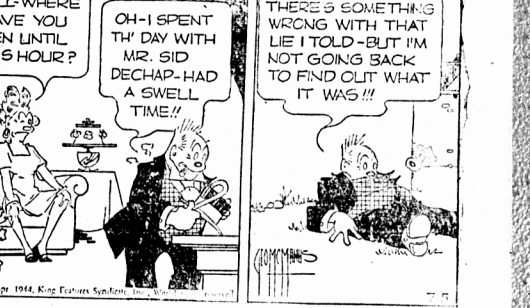

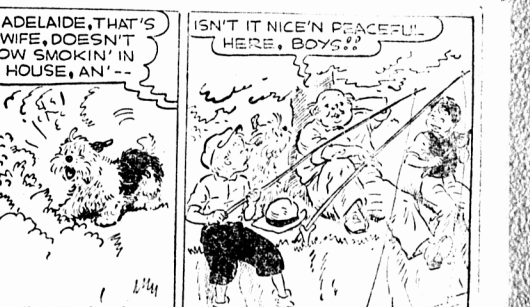
