MORELL FARMERS INSTITUTE.—A meeting of this Institute was held on Friday last in Morell Hall, the President, Mr. Dingwell presiding. The Commissioner of Agriculture, Hon. W. M. Lea, gave a splendid address from the standpoint of general farming. A subject which he was well able to handle from the practical side. He laid special emphasis on the value of stock feeding, the handling of manures, and the selection of live stock and his remarks were followed with a great deal of interest by the large audience. Mr. W. Boulter of the Agricultural Department was also present and gave an address dealing principally with the sale of wool through the Sheep Breeders Association and the importance of taking immediate action to improve the condition of our rural schools. A hearty vote of thanks moved by Mr. G. Grant, was tendered the speakers before the meeting adjourned.
