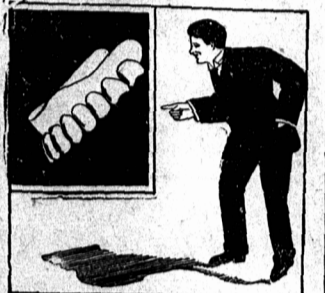

FLORAL MEETING.—The meeting of the Floral Association of Prince Edward Island which was to have been held Saturday evening is postponed until Friday evening, June 13th.

APPRECIATED.—At the close of the Methodist District meeting at York a hearty vote of thanks and appreciation was given to the chairman, Rev. F. A. Wightman in view of his work of presiding over the District during the past year, and also in view of his early departure from the island after seventeen years of residence and work. Mr. Wightman expressed his appreciation and said that during his stay in the province he had preached or spoke in every Methodist church in the country with the exception of four or five. At the close of the business the chairman reached to a full house.

KINGSTON MEETING.—The Supervisor of Women's Institutes held a meeting in the hall at Kingston on Thursday, June 5th, to talk over the subject of organization in that section. After a detailed explanation of the work, it was decided by those present to hold another meeting on Monday, June 9th at 8 p. m. in the schoolhouse, when the subject will be more fully discussed and a date set for organization. A large number of ladies from Kingston and the neighboring districts should make an effort to be present as a Women's Institute will be found a great source of help to everyone, including, as it does, a study of the proper selection and preparation of foods, the care, feeding and training of children, sanitation in the home, care of the sick, school improvement, village libraries, beautifying the home and its surroundings, in fact all subjects which deal with the every day responsibilities of women and tend toward necessary improvement in community and home life.

NEW BRIDGE, ETC.—The sections of Crapaud, Westmorland, Kelly's Cross, Brookvale and Embyvale, have been visited recently by Hon. James L. McNeill, Commissioner of Public Works, and Mr. McKay, the Department's Engineer, attending to preparations necessary for the construction and repairing of bridges, and opening of roads under their supervision. They were accompanied by the alert and worthy representative Mr. H. Myers, M.L.A. In consequence many old bridges which have been damaged, and some completely washed away, by the unusual, and severe frosts of last spring, will in the near future be replaced by new and more durable structures.

WOMEN'S INSTITUTE.—At the leadwork Schoolhouse on Tuesday afternoon the Women's Institute of that district held their regular monthly meeting. A large number of members and some visitors were present which goes to show that interest in Institute work is spreading rapidly. The main part of the meeting was devoted to a discussion on the improvements necessary for the interior of the schoolhouse as soon as possible. Such a movement on the part of the women who realize the necessity of a clean, comfortable and sanitary school is highly commendable and is an object lesson to women in other parts of the Province. Surely the organization of Women's Institutes was a good thing when it had done nothing more than to open the eyes of parents to the fact that the place where their children spend more than half of every school-day during eight of the most impressionable years of their lives, should be in as good condition and as well kept and attractive as the best one in the district. Besides these outside interests the women of Meadownbank are having talks and discussions on reasonable topics, such as ardent, canning and other such constructive and helpful subjects.
