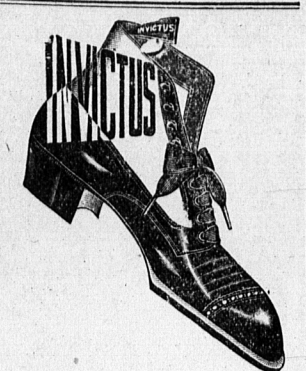

Tuesday, Mass. newspapers to hand contain reports of the death of George Fletcher, of Raynham, Mass., who was a cousin of C. P. Fletcher of this City and Hon. J. H. Fletcher ex-Governor of N. Dakota, now here on a visit. The death resulted from a lightning stroke during a terrible electric storm which passed over that vicinity on the 23rd inst. Mr. Fletcher, who lived about half a mile from Raynham Center on Pleasant street, had driven down to meet Mrs. Fletcher at the trolley line at the center. They arrived home at the height of the storm and Mr. Fletcher went to the barn to put up his horse and attend to other duties, while Mrs. Fletcher went in about her household duties. About 8.30 Mr. Fletcher came in and went to the kitchen sink to wash his hands. A crash of thunder and a blinding flash of light came and Mrs. Fletcher saw her husband fall to the floor. She tried to aid him, but was powerless. Her daughters and a young man who was calling at the house were called in and as they worked over the prostrated form in an endeavor to bring back some signs of animation it was discovered that the house was on fire. Attempts were made to telephone for aid, but in the storms the wires were useless. A breathless run to the center found the pastor of the church, who sent the bell ringing and the neighbors rallied as rapidly as possible. The body of Mr. Fletcher was carefully taken in the meantime, from the home to a place of safety near by. The call for aid came too late, however, to save the home, and it was burned flat to the ground, little of its contents being saved. The barn which stood next at hand was untouched. Dr. Dwinell had been summoned from Tannan to attend Mr. Fletcher, but when he arrived he found life was extinct. Mr. Fletcher was a man respected and well known in Raynham and his tragic death came as a severe shock to the whole community. He leaves a widow and two daughters, one of them married, to mourn his loss, and they have the sympathy of the community.
