A correspondent writes: A farmer living a few miles east of Summerside was seen to work a grey horse until he dropped, and then it took a half hour hard usage to get him on his feet again.

The Summerside market prices remain unchanged. Butter is twenty to twenty-five cents per pound, potatoes twenty cents a bushel, oats thirty-eight and thirty-nine cents a bushel, and pork eight to eight and three quarter cents per pound.

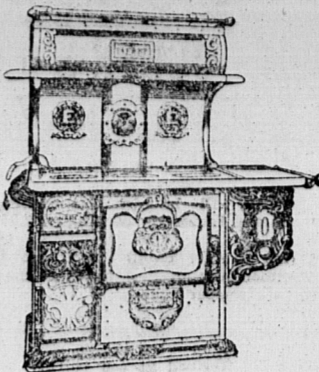

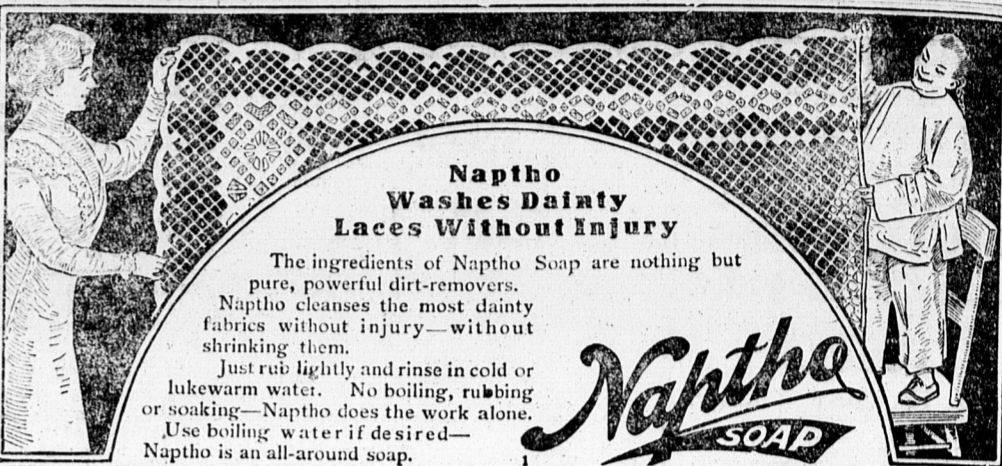
