AMERICAN WAR LOSSES.

So much attention has been bestowed upon the war in South Africa and we have felt so deeply the loss of brave men killed and wounded in that regrettable conflict that we have almost lost sight for the time of another war which has been progressing for a longer time in the Philippine Islands.

It is to be observed that these are the deaths alone. If the experience of the British forces in South Africa affords any guide in estimating the number of wounded by the number of the dead, we might calculate upon three wounded for every one killed in battle.

The money cost of the war in the Philippines has been already much greater in proportion to the loss of life than the war in South Africa.

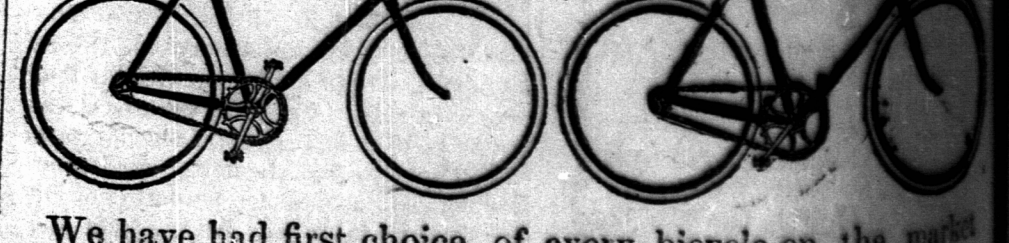

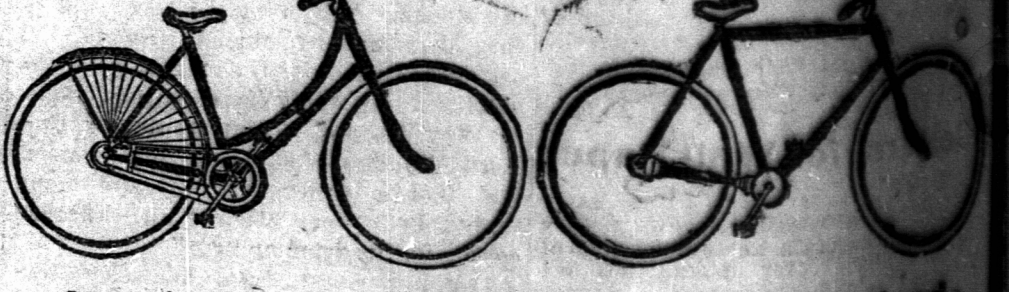
