some months, but up until a short time before his death he was able to move about the house. A couple of days before the coming of the end he was struck with what proved to be pneumonia. In the weakness of his advanced years the system was not able to resist the ravages of this dread disease and on the above mentioned date the spirit returned to the God who gave it. Mr. Nicholson leaves to mourn the loss of a kind and loving father, one son and one daughter. The son, Malcolm Nicholson, lived with his father in the old home and the daughter, Miss Mabel resides in New York.

Mr. Nicholson was one of a family of three brothers and two sisters, of these only one survives him, namely Mr. Malcolm Nicholson of Quincy, Mass. Those who predeceased him were brother Mr. Duncan Nicholson, Da-lington and two sisters, Mrs. Roderick McLeod and Mrs. Mary, of Hopedale. The wife of the deceased was Miss Katherine McLeod, who passed away in 1914. Of the early settlers in this section of P. E. Island Mr. Nicholson was one of the first and was widely and favorably known. His forefathers came from Ruar, Inverness Co., Scotland and on the Island in 1891.

Here they carved their names out of the primeval forest. Through all of the intervening years Mr. Nicholson's family stood for the things that were best.

In whatever was for the best interests of the community Mr. Donald Nicholson took a deep interest. Of recent years because of advanced age he lived quietly at home. Almost all of his old friends had passed away so that life had become quite lonely. The coming of the end found him ready and the call to his eternal home was to him a welcome message.

The funeral was held on the afternoon of Saturday May 12th. The service was conducted by Rev. R. H. Stavert.
