THE KING HONORS FRENCH OFFICIALS.

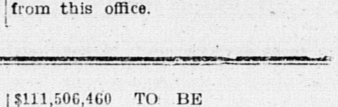

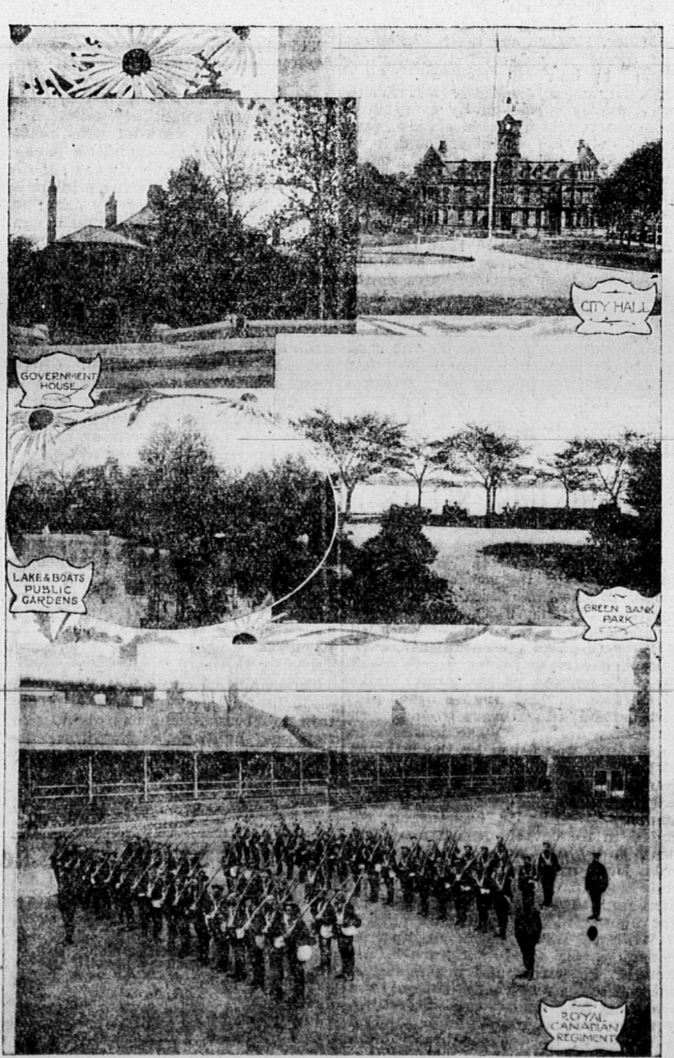
