LIQUOR TRADERS' TROUBLES.

An important decision was rendered by Chief Justice Tuck of St. John the other day in which it was held that a wholesale liquor dealing firm in that city could not recover the price of a quantity of liquors sold to a retail dealer in Westville, Nova Scotia, where the Scott Act is in force.

It is good law it would doubtless apply to wholesalers on the mainland who sell to Scott Act and Prohibition Act violators in this Province as well as in Nova Scotia. We are firm believers that what a man buys and takes delivery of, he ought to pay for, but ethical principles have recovery large place in the liquor traffic in general, and still less among those who are carrying on the trade in defiance of law.

We have in mind a story told of a retail dealer in a near-by Province who was carrying on business in this way. He had victimised the wholesalers of St. John and Halifax and had been buying of the late Owen Murphy of Quebec. The wholesaler became imperative in his demands. The bill had been long standing and ought to be paid. He was rewarded not with a remittance but with a laconic epistle like this: "You say that you are Owen Murphy and that I also am Owen Murphy. How can this be? You also say that your bill has been running for a long time. How would it do to let it stand for a change and get rested?"

We have evidence all about us that the way of the illegal vendor of liquors is like that of other transgressors a hard

one. Fine and imprisonment are hanging over him. He cannot always trust his customers. They may be caught in the police court and asked where they procured their liquor. And it may be dangerous to refuse a suspected customer lest in revenge he tell of previous transactions. So we see that in the trade the wholesaler often has troubles with the retailer and the latter has his own troubles with his customers and with the law. And we fear they may yet meet worse troubles in the life beyond.

The liquor traffic is now and has been illegal through the province. It is considered disreputable by the great majority of our people. It is viewed with disfavor throughout Canada. It is therefore high time for those who have been in the business to make a change to some more honorable and honest calling. We would be glad to find them adopting that course; it would be to their credit, and also to their profit in the long run, for if we know anything of the temper of the people of this Province they are determined to give the violators a hard time and increase their troubles in the years to come.

POWER TO GRANT DEGREES.

A PRETTY BIG INDIAN SCHEME

LASHORE, May 3.—A company has been formed, with a capital of two millions sterling, to construct a hydro-electric power installation in Kashmir by harnessing the Jhelum river.

The prospectus states that the available power is practically unlimited, and will be utilized to supply the current for an electric railway, 200 miles in length, to connect Addoabad, with Srinagar; to propel a large fleet of powerful electric dredgers which will be employed in safeguarding Kashmir against disastrous floods, and in reclaiming valuable rice-producing tracts of land from the marshes; to supply the motive power for numerous proposed factories, and thus serve to convert Kashmir into the Lancashire India; to impart new energy to the great silk industries of the province; to supply power for local tramways and light rail ways, arsenals, workshops, foundries and mines, and provide the current and electric lighting, and for driving punkahs in the big military cantonments of Northern India.

The price of electric power will be less than half that of steam power. The initial supply will be equivalent to eighty thousand horse power. The scheme, when carried out, will be the biggest of its kind in the world.
