C.N.R. SHIPS DUE AT HALIFAX
MONTREAL, Que. Sept. 11—The first passenger ship to be delivered from a United States to a Canadian arrival port due to the strikes of Maritime workers and truckers in the United States will arrive in Halifax on Friday, M. E. Doka, general passenger agent, Canadian National Railways, says today. The vessel, the S. S. Rangatikki was bound for New York carrying 179 civilians from overseas.
The Canadian National Railways will operate a special train out of Halifax for the transportation of the inland passenger movement; similar arrangements are being made to handle the persons who will travel from New York and Montreal to Halifax to call on the Rangatikki.

ANTIQUE CRAZE SEIZES BUYERS

"Once a couple acquire a pair of 18th century chairs, a Federal table or old copper lamp base, antique shopping will be a chronic thing in their marriage," says dealer Joseph Daniels, niece of Joseph Daniels, ex-American ambassador to Mexico.
Right now things only 20 years old (hand-painted china, cut glass, and other characteristic pieces) which only a few years ago could be bought for a few dollars, suddenly cost fifty times as much. These cycles occur, she believes, because each generation gets in thrill out of collecting things from its own childhood.

Social Service Work Discussed By Anglicans

WINNIPEG, Sept. 10 (CP) — Calling upon Federal Government to give "every assistance" in the dispersal of Japanese residents of British Columbia across Canada, the Anglican General Synod today passed a motion asking Anglicans to "extend a helping hand in the reception and settlement of these people."
The resolution was recommended in the report of the Church Council for social service.
The Synod also recorded its opposition to the extension of legalized gambling opportunities in Canada. Rev. D. S. H. Prince of Halifax, in making the report, said gamblers had become "parasites on society."
Gambling is the number one enemy of the economic and moral life of this country. In any economic process, both parties should gain.
An amendment to the resolution, made by Dr. Charlotte Whitton, Ottawa, asked all members of the church to oppose any extension of gambling facilities. It was passed.
Rev. C. P. Riley, Toronto, said the extension of legalized gambling and other popular games of chance. He said the same thing might be applied to the wheat, stocks and cotton exchanges, where gambling was taken as a matter of practice.
Dr. Prince said a distinction must be kept between gambling and speculation.
Earlier, the Synod rejected by 100-56 a resolution which asked the Prime Minister to appoint a committee to investigate the companies invested in by the church's consolidated fund board.
Other resolutions passed by the Synod called for federal aid in the construction of low-cost housing, and endorsed "the movement to secure by law compulsory premarital health examinations."

NEW AIRSERVICE TO START
WINNIPEG, Man., Sept. 11—Inauguration of a new International Air Service between Port Arthur, Port William and Duluth was announced today by W. F. English, vice president Trans-Canada Air Lines, it becomes effective Sept. 19.
The service will be operated daily except Sunday with one round trip covering the 178 miles between Port Arthur and Duluth, and another round trip between Port Arthur and Duluth at 30 A. M. leaving Duluth at 10:45, returning to Port Arthur at 11:46 A. M. from Duluth to arrive at Lakehead 12:55 noon.
By connections with northwest airlines at Duluth into Chicago and Denver. Passengers will reach Toronto in 8 hours 20 minutes and New York in less than 11 hours. The service will arrive at the network at Chicago and will proceed east over its system from that point. T. C. A. will co-operate with the chambers of commerce of the Lakehead cities in preview flights to Duluth next weekend and Duluth to Port Arthur.
The Airlines is now establishing its various departments at its base at the Lakehead airport. The aircraft and crew which will inaugurate the service will arrive at the Lakehead on noon Wednesday.
