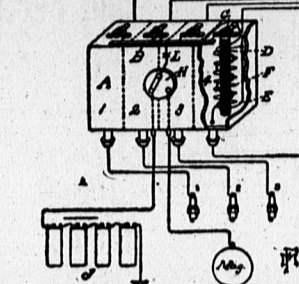

HINTS FOR The Motorist BY ALBERT L. CLOUGH

IGNITION: THE VIBRATOR COIL SYSTEM

This system, sometimes known as the multiple-coil system, although used upon very different models of cars, at the present time is standard equipment upon cars of the most widely used make, millions of which are in service and thus merit a description. In the accompanying diagram of such a system intended for a four-cylinder engine. A represents the coil-box containing four identical vibrator coils of so-called unit type, that are arranged to be really removable from any replaceable in the box. The circuit connections are permanently made to terminals fixed in the inside of the box itself and each coil unit carries contact pieces, which engage with these terminals so that, when a coil unit is inserted into one of the four contact sockets, it is automatically placed in circuit by one side of its primary coil being electrically connected to the common connection bar B, the other side of its primary coil is to one of the



four wires leading to the timer or commutator C and the live terminal of its secondary coil to one of the four heavily insulated, high-tension terminals at the bottom of the coil box, to which the sparking plug cables are attached. This makes it possible to replace a defective coil without interfering with the other units and to substitute one coil unit off another, in the case of ignition troubles. The enclosing case of one of the coil units is represented as cut away, showing the core D, the primary coil E (in heavy lines), the secondary coil F (in light lines), and the vibrator G—the automatic connections of the coil unit to the coil box not being shown. It is a three-point switch mounted upon the front of the coil-box, having its arm connected to the common primary bar B, one of its points connected to one terminal of the battery of dry-cells J (the other terminal of which is grounded).

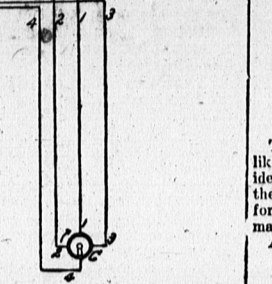

ROME, June 10.—Former Premier Giolitti will probably succeed Nitti as head of the Italian government, it was believed today, following the resignation of the Nitti cabinet and announcement that Vittorio Orlando had decided to resign as President of the Chamber of Deputies. It was believed that this would relieve the tense internal situation. Socialist deputies cheered vociferously when Nitti announced that the decree increasing flour and bread prices had been rescinded. Counter shouting by the Conservative group transformed the Chamber session into a veritable bedlam. Personal encounters between deputies of opposing factions led to great confusion. After the announcement that the bread decree had been annulled Nitti announced his resignation and those of all his cabinet members. He added that they would remain in office until a new government could be formed.

vibrator coil was originally intended to be operated on direct or continuous current, the type of magneto from which it is taken is one which produces an alternating current that charges its direction sixteen times each revolution of the engine crankshaft and falls to zero between each alternate; but as these zero points are very short, current is available practically the time and the current is not to act satisfactorily. The master vibrator system, quite large in use, is a modification of the above described system and in it the vibrators on the individual coil units are removed, or at least connected into the circuit at the point L between the switch and the common connection bar B, so that it acts to open and close the primary circuit of each coil unit as the current is directed to it by the action of the timer. By this arrangement the sparks produced at all the plugs are uniform in timing and intensity, because the action of all the coils is controlled by the same vibrator, which operates uniformly and not by individual vibrators having differing periods of vibration. The master vibrator itself is merely a vibrating spark coil with the secondary coil omitted, there being but a single winding carrying the common primary current, to magnetize the core, that operates the vibrating interrupter. Still another variation of the multiple coil system of ignition consists in doing away with the individual coil vibrators, using plain coils and employing a timer, not of the roller and segment type just described, but one capable of being answered in this circuit through each coil in rotation and producing a quick break—four interrupting devices similar to that used in the distributor system being required, combined in a single timer unit.

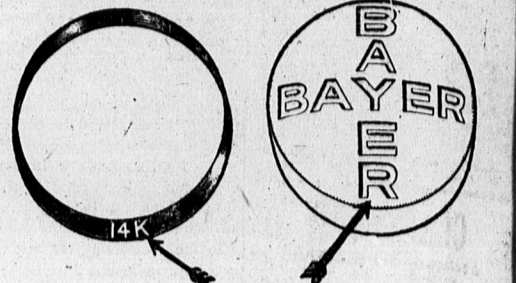
