The following are the Souris market prices: Potatoes, per bushel, 28 cents; oats, per bushel, 42 cents; pork, per pound, 10 1/2 cents; beef, per pound, 16 cents; butter, per pound, 27 cents; eggs, per dozen, 18 cents; hides, per pound, 8 1/2 cents, and hay, per ton, \$12 to \$14.

In Montague dealers are paying thirty-eight to forty cents a bus for oats twenty-two to twenty-five cents a bus for potatoes, sixteen cents a doz for eggs, ten fifty a ton for loose hay, ten and a half cents a lb for pork, twenty to twenty-two cents a lb for butter and eight to nine cents a lb for hides.

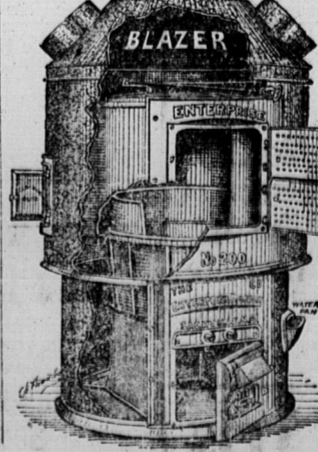

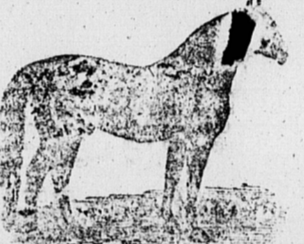

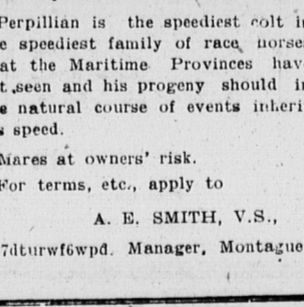
