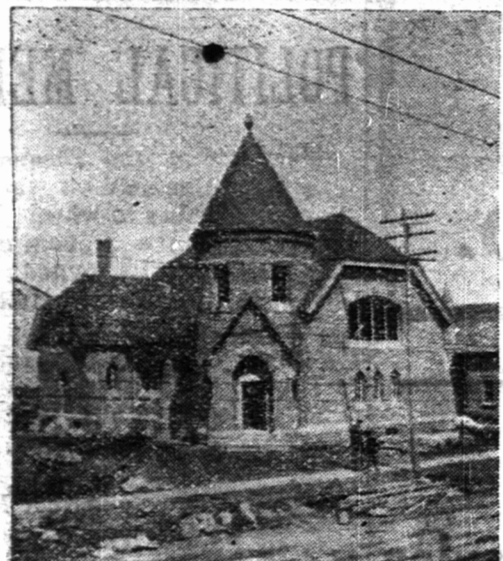
## VICTORIA DIVISION

### Observes its Fifty Second Anniversary

#### BY ATTENDING CHURCH

Address Delivered by the  
Chaplain, of the Division  
Rev. Robt. F. Whiston.

A large congregation was present at Central Church last evening to hear Rev. R. F. Whiston, Chaplain of the Victoria Division, deliver an eloquent discourse on the great temperance question. Victoria Division, No. 4 Sons of Temperance, under whose auspices the service was held, was organized in this city on the 21st October, 1848, making it just fifty two years old. The original charter members are names well known to the older inhabitants of Charlottetown and are as follows:—John Arbuckle, George W. Owen, Charles Drew, John Gaskin, William B. Lawson, Benjamin Chappell, John LePage, George Moore, Richard Smith, John Scott, James Handcock, George Butcher, Andrew Bealston, William Douglass, Mathew May, Charles T. Harris, John McNeill and John McKay. Out of these eighteen names there is not, we believe, one survivor. The Charter is signed by Samuel F. Carey, Most Worthy Patriarch of the National Division, still living in Cincinnati Ohio. Victoria Division has seen many

The greatest problem of the age, is scope, extent and importance is that of the saloon. For years have we looked toward its solution, but in vain. seeker secured the coveted prize only over the dead bodies of his two predecessors, so we shall gain our object, only as others have made it possible.

We need more temperance agitation. Wrongs are never righted except by agitation. Every step taken in advance is at the cost of agitation and annoyance to many people. It makes for righteousness and is the price of liberty, yet to be attained. We cry aloud for our favorite party, canvass the communities, organize party clubs. Why not for temperance? The Sons of Temperance have a Divine right for existence. A greater right than Tupper, or Laurier or Davis Club.

We must look at this question from three stand points, that of legislation, education, and that of the church. Education alone will not rid us of the stench of the saloon marshes. Isolation is as necessary as education. We must educate to legislate and legislate to isolate. The saloon is damnation, and to rid us of it, the combined attacking forces of education, legislation and salvation are necessary. What responsibility rests upon the Church of Jesus Christ in this matter? Men and women, some of Canada's brightest gems, are filling drunkard's graves. Wives are made widows, children orphans. We find violence, starvation, wretchedness and woe everywhere. Who or what is to blame? O receive the logic of Divine law. Who is to blame? You say. Intoxicating drinks? Who is responsible for that? The saloon. Who is responsible for the saloon? The law. Who makes the law? The people. Who holds the balance of power among the people? The Church of Jesus Christ. Oh that we might awaken to our sense of duty in this matter. The greatest power in the world for righteousness is Christian sentiment. No government dare legislate against it. When the church demands the downfall of this cursed thing, it will totter and fall to eternal perdition. It came from hell, send it back. If the present Government won't give us a prohibitory law, smash it and keep on smashing until we get one that will recognize the voice of the Church of our Lord.

Let me read the true bill of indictment, found by the grand jury of public safety, morality and religion.

Intemperance cuts down youth in its vigor, manhood in its strength, and age in its weakness. It breaks the father's heart, bereaves the doting mother, extinguishes natural affection, blots out filial attachment, erases conjugal love, blights parental hope and brings down mourning age to the grave.

It produces weakness, not strength, sickness, not health, death, not life. It feeds rheumatism, nurses gout, welcomes epidemics, invites cholera, import pestilence and embraces consumption. It covers the land with idleness, poverty disease and crime. It fills your jails, supplies your almshouses. It degrades the citizen, debases the legislature, dishonors the statesman and disarms the patriot. It is the sum of all villainies, the father of all crimes, the mother of all abominations, the devil's best friend and God's worst enemy. Such is the indictment.

Therefore I impeach King Alcohol as guilty of high crimes against the peace of society, the property of the province, the welfare of mankind and the majesty of Heaven.

I impeach him in the name of every man woman and child, widow and orphan, who are suffering from his bloody hand. Before the bar of public judgment thus tried and convicted as the most awful felon and murderer in human society, let him be sentenced according to his guilt and crimes.

1 Chron. 16:8. "After calling the attention of his congregation to that important event in the life of the Israelites people out of which there grew this solemn thanksgiving service recorded in this chapter. Mr. McConnell said the obligation contained in the text rests upon us no less than it did upon the men of that age. If ever there was a time in the life of the Canadian people when they should respond to this appeal of Heaven that time is the present. Give consideration to the whole matter of our national domain!

embraced in the whole of Europe. But what might not one say of quality as well as quantity when the French King ceded Canada to Great Britain he consoled himself by saying that he had only signed away "a few acres of snow." People at home and abroad, indeed people everywhere are waking up to the fact that this is one of the best—the richest—the most wholesome—the grandest countries under the heavens. Reference was made to the wonderful development of the northwest territories in the past few years. 45% of the population of the Dominion fixed their means of living in agricultural pursuits. What mineral wealth Almighty God has stored away in this country. The richest corner of Canada's storehouse is that which holds her minerals. In the richness of Canada's forests, in the value of her fisheries in the admirable physical features of this country we see much that should cause us to be thankful to God. What magnificent possibilities. What immense resources, what glorious opportunities open to us to day! After dwelling on the prosperity that obtains in every section of the Dominion recognizing in it all the goodness of God, Mr. McConnell spoke of the proud position we hold today in the British Empire. Never in the history of this great country did Canada occupy the place she does today. The year has been an eventful year. It is a rather significant thing that in the last year of this grand old Century so memorable and inspiring a page has been written in our history. It has been a year in which we have had a hand in the task of Empire building and have sent out our Regiments to do battle beside the veterans of the British army for the common cause and the common flag. From every one of the Provinces contribution of treasure and of men was made. A year ago our Canadian boys were hastening to South Africa. We have not forgotten the events of that time. Today many of them are returning having covered themselves with glory. In that struggle we have given as a Dominion both of our treasure and our blood but through these things this mighty Empire shall be all the more strongly cemented together. A touching reference was made to the deaths of Taylor and Riggs, the only men of the Island Contingent who have thus far fallen and for both of whom Mr. McConnell held memorial services. In a few days we hope the greater number remaining of the First Contingent shall land on our shores. That they shall receive a most hearty welcome, there can be no doubt. They are deserving of it. They have nobly upheld the honor of this country and it is fitting that she should throw wide the "portals of her gratitude." We should thank God for our success and go out into the future with a deeper sense of our dependence upon Him. The national outlook is bright, never in the march of the years was it brighter. It is as true to-day as it was thousands of years ago that righteousness exalteth a nation. In closing Mr. McConnell spoke of the prosperity of the Church of Jesus Christ in the world during the past year. The Bohra Conqueror is bounding on by imposing strides to universal triumph. May this year be one in which our lives shall be marked by the intensest devotion to the interests of His Kingdom.

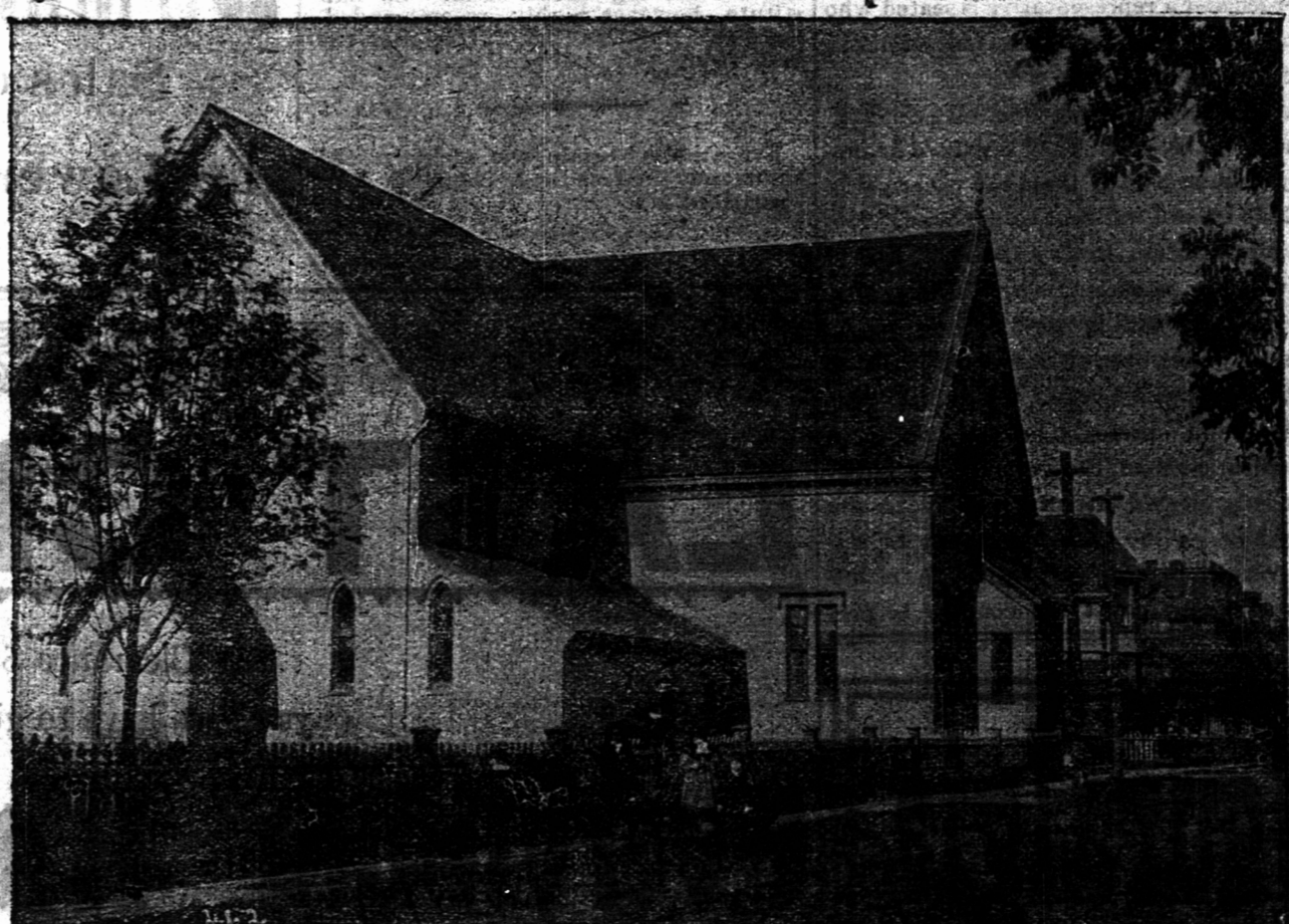
